ABSTRACT:

This project proposes a multi-sectorial approach to prepare young people ageing out of care and improve their wellbeing and prospects for an independent life. Young people from state and private care organisations are involved in developing various models of support.

The objectives are:

- to equip young people with information and competences to support transition out-of-care and access to employment and a fulfilled life;
- to provide care professionals and organisations with trainings and evidence-based proved models of supporting care leavers, in particular in the area of building life-skills, job coaching and mentoring;
- to explore public-private partnerships between local and national authorities, NGOs and the business sector to better support young people ageing out of care.

The activities of the project can be clustered in three categories:

- Activities involving care leavers and professionals to develop a handbook for life-skills ("school-for-life"), job-coaching and mentoring services (WP2);
- Activities targeting the NGO sector, national and local authorities and the small and medium enterprises in shaping CSR activities to address the needs of care leavers (WP 2);

- Certified training activities for professionals to support care leavers (WP 3)
- and in addition, awareness raising and advocacy for an enabling environment to ensure the best outcomes possible for care leavers are planned (WP 4).

The project is led by CONCORDIA Humanitarian Organisation Romania and involves furthers 2 partners from Bulgaria and Romania. It primarily targets care leavers in Romania and Bulgaria but the project's deliverables have European relevance and will be promoted in Europe through the organisations' memberships to Eurochild, and other European networks.

During its two years of implementation (January 2019 - December 2020), the project will directly address at least 200 care leavers, more than 200 care professionals, five local authorities, one ministry and more than 100 SMEs.
