### ABSTRACT:

The overall objective is to contribute to the prevention of gender-based violence (GBV) by improving the awareness of young people about all forms of GBV, its causes, consequences and providing tools to prevent, recognize and counter it. This involves tackling and changing sexist attitudes, behaviours, prejudices and stereotypes, and increasing GBV visibility.

The project will involve 3 multicultural countries: Denmark, Romania and Spain, and will be developed in the framework of Interarts' DECIDES Programme.

Activities will be carried out at national and international level:

National level: comprise workshops for young students to discuss and provide information about prevention, cultural and social aspects related to GBV. Such workshops will refer to different cultural and artistic disciplines (visual arts and forum theatre), and will bring to the creation of specific cultural outputs. Seminars and trainings addressed to students will train them as peer educators and to teachers to increase their capacity of detecting potential victims.

International level: exchange visits to allow beneficiaries to meet different realities; final international conference celebrated at the end of the project with participants from different EU countries; 1 online platform created to disseminate in languages the project's outputs.

The project will directly benefit: 3000 students (15-18, 60% girls), 100 school staff, 20 local/national public authorities, 300 parents, 60 schools, 10 social, 10 health workers, 10 police officers.

Expected results increased capacity of stakeholders to address GBV; increased awareness of sexual and GBV; changes in the attitudes and behaviours as regards the issue of GBV especially among young people; strengthened cooperation and exchange of information.

### ABSTRACT:

The Project “The Hidden gender messages in fairy tales – Let’s read the fairy tales up-side down” has duration 24 months and will be implemented in three EU Member States – Bulgaria, Greece and Italy. The main objective of the project is preventing gender-based violence by disputing gender stereotypes from an early childhood in the EU.

Will be worked gender analysis of 9 classical fairy tales for children. 180 teachers from childcare for preschoolers from three EU countries will be trained about introducing the gender issues in pre-school children’s education (5-7 years old), using classical fairy tales.

The educators will acquire knowledge and skills to help children develop critical thinking about the gender roles and social norms which raises gender inequality. Experimentally 250 preschool children /5-7 years/ and their parents from the three EU countries will be involved in 123 workshops to increase their understanding and sensitivity on the subject of gender equality. Will be produced a methodology, practical guide and online platform for distance-training of children’s teachers for gender education of pre-school children through classical fairy tales, which will be disseminated across the EU.

Direct beneficiaries from the project will be 250 children at the age from 5 to 7 years old, from three EU Member states and their parents and 180 kindergarten teachers, preschool teachers, sport-trainers, teachers of free/informal activities, children mentors from three EU countries. Indirect

beneficiaries from the project will be kindergarten teachers and professionals, who work with children from the whole EU.

As a result from the project will be created model for gender education of children, which aims to prepare the children from an early age to build strong relationships for overcoming the gender stereotype. Will be increased capacity of kindergarten's teachers from the EU for introducing the gender issue in children education.

### ABSTRACT:

#### Objectives

The project works with evidence based strategies from a holistic and whole-system approach to prevent GBV. The objectives is to scale up and deliver interventions (fathers' groups and school-based interventions, SBI) by training volunteers and professionals. One objective is to set up a supporting structure and implementation cycle (training for trainers, coaching/support, M&E and networks) for long-term sustainable implementation, including aggregation and sharing of experiences gained in local implementation. The project aims at strengthening local, national and European collaboration. We work with awareness raising and capacity building through various communication efforts.

The overall objective is a decrease in GBV and increased involvement of men and boys in gender equality. We expect increased awareness on fathers and care work, GBV prevention, the continuum of violence and masculinity. Challenging of stereotypical gender norms, and more bystander interventions. CONSCIOUS aims to prevent reoffending by sex offenders and perpetrators of domestic violence through a model of inter-systemic cooperation between social-health authorities, CSOs, judicial and prison systems, capable to intervene on perpetrators within and outside prisons towards their social reintegration, acting, thus, on social exclusion that may lead to reoffending.

### ABSTRACT:

ViDaCS (Violent Dad in Child Shoes) aims at developing an innovative multiagency protocol for the self-assessment of perpetrators. ViDaCS addresses the call purpose of preventing and combating gender-based violence under the main priority of “Treatment of perpetrators”, in order to prevent reoffending.

ViDaCS project aims at:

- OB. 1 - Develop, experiment and validate an innovative practice to intercept the “silent” perpetrators and address them towards the treatment;
