



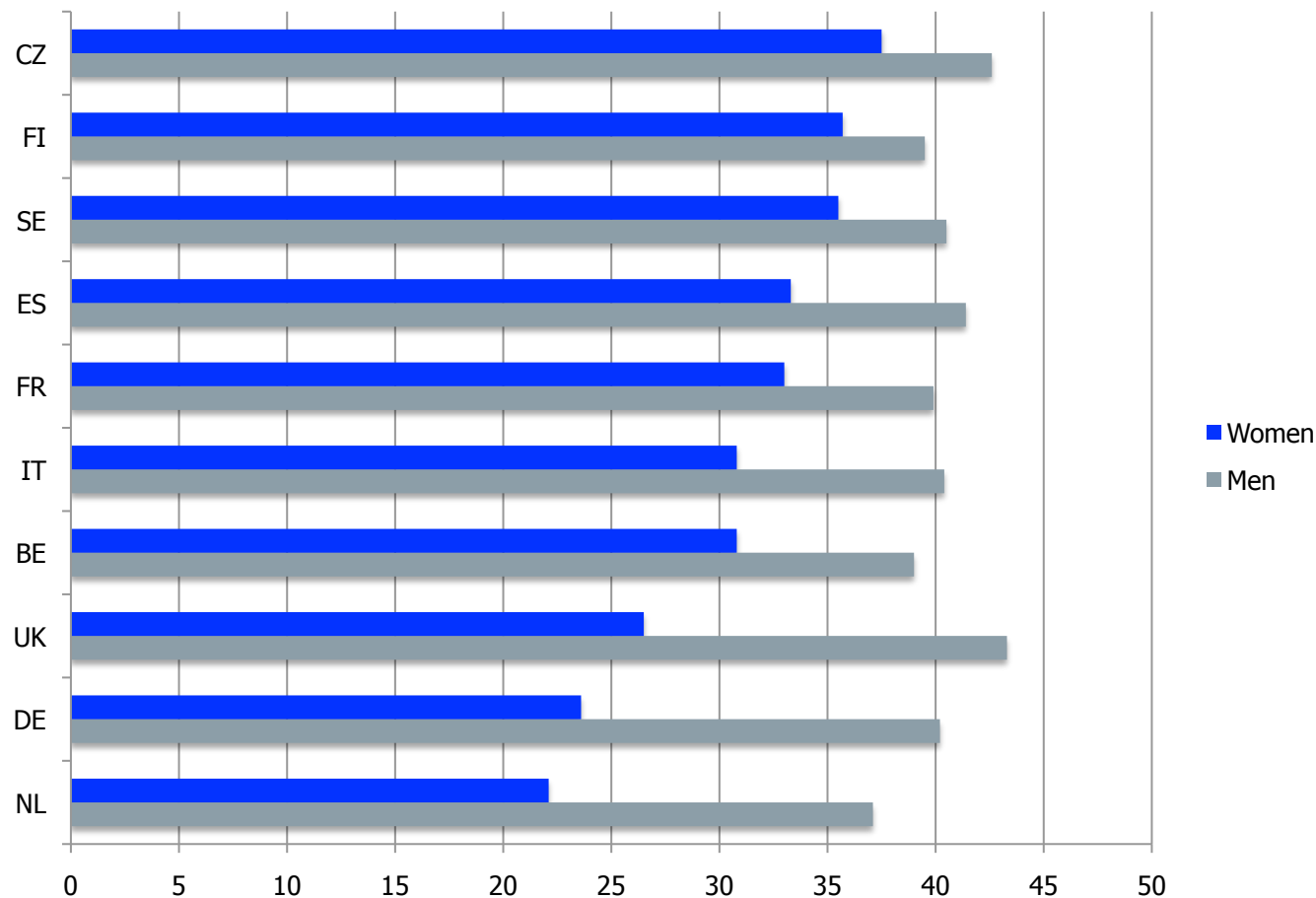

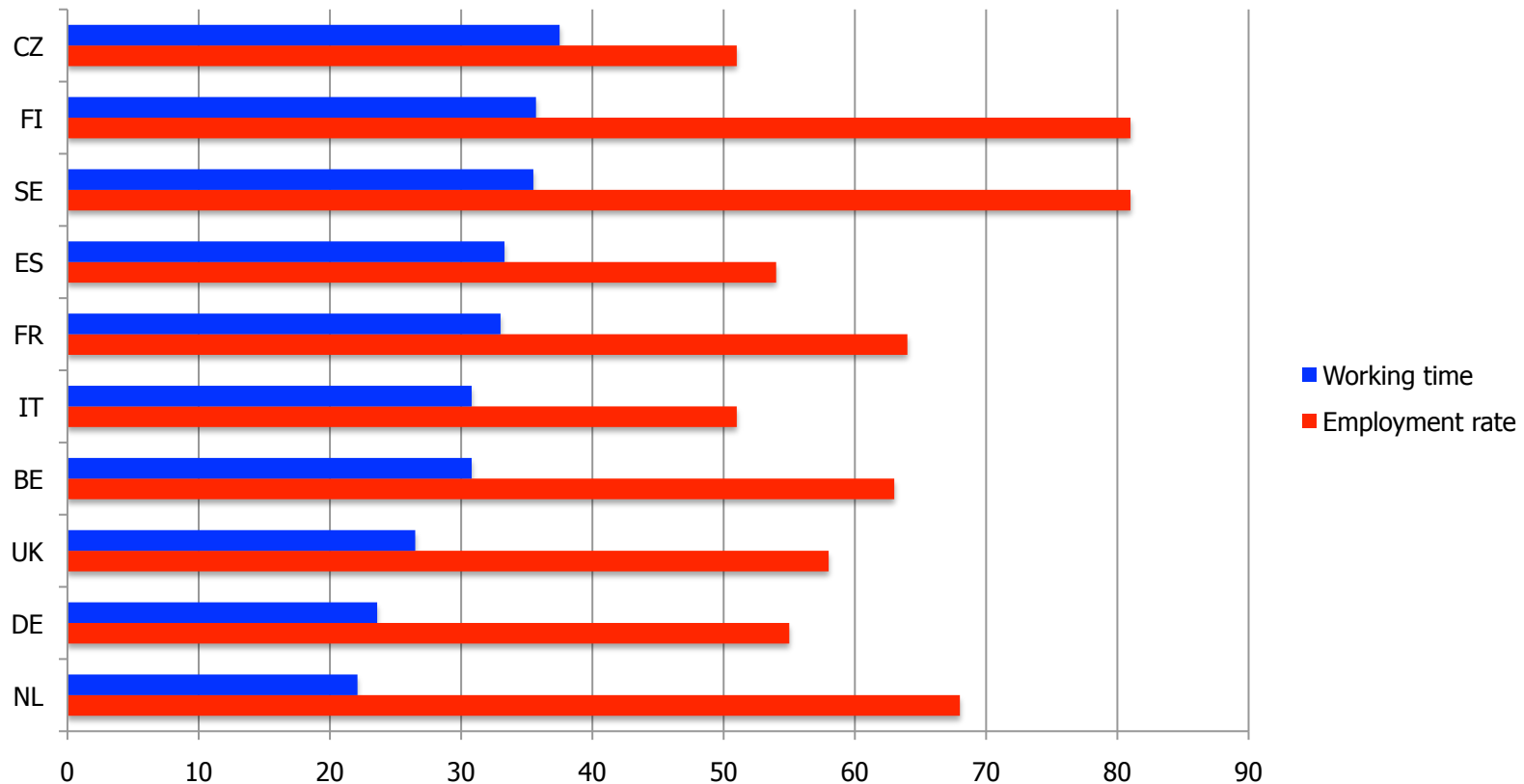
## Working-times of women and men with children (3-5\*), 2008

## Working-times (hrs) and employment rates (%) of women with children (age of youngest child 3-5)

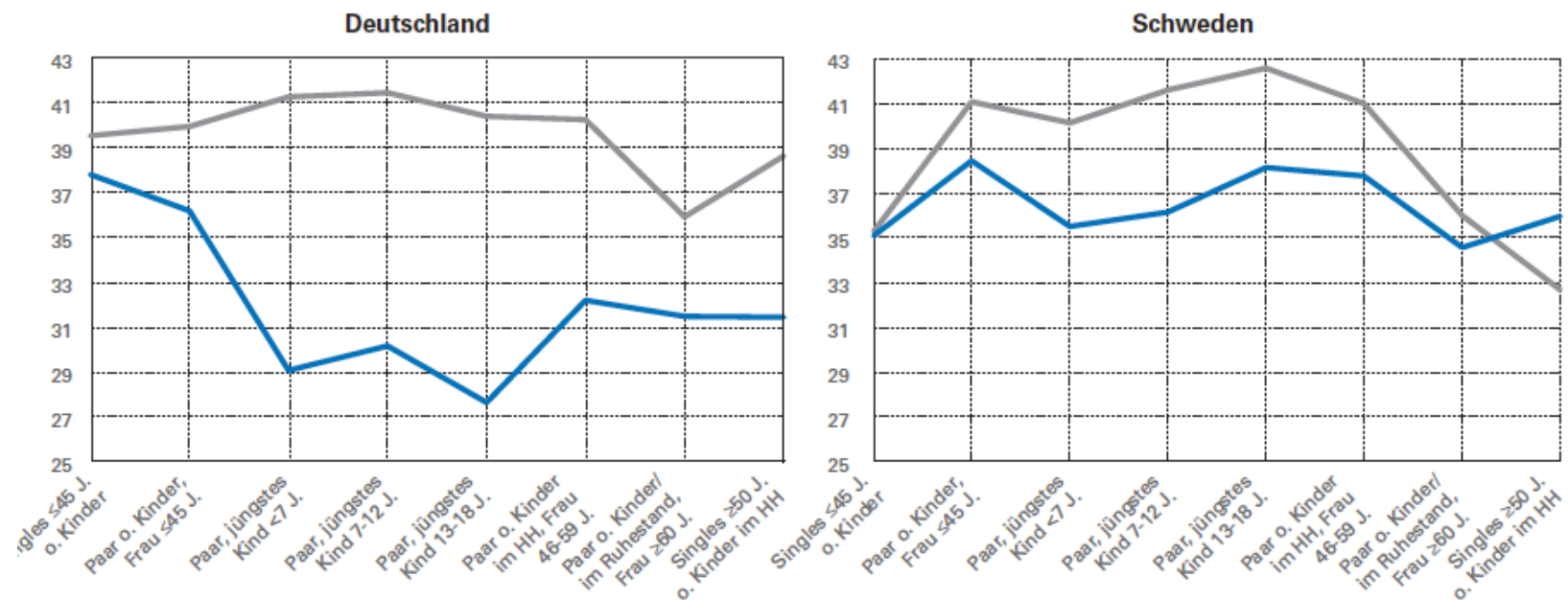

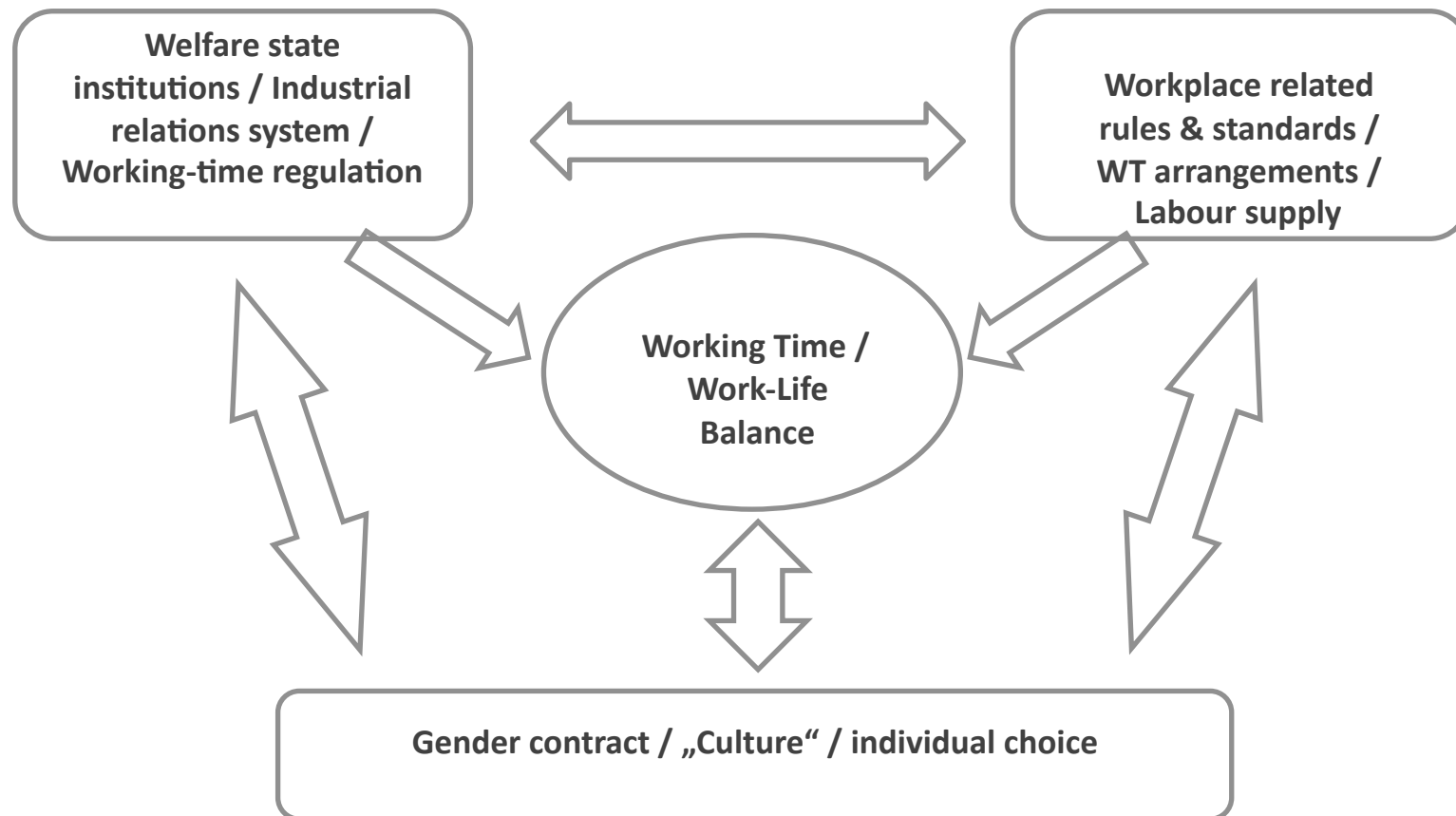

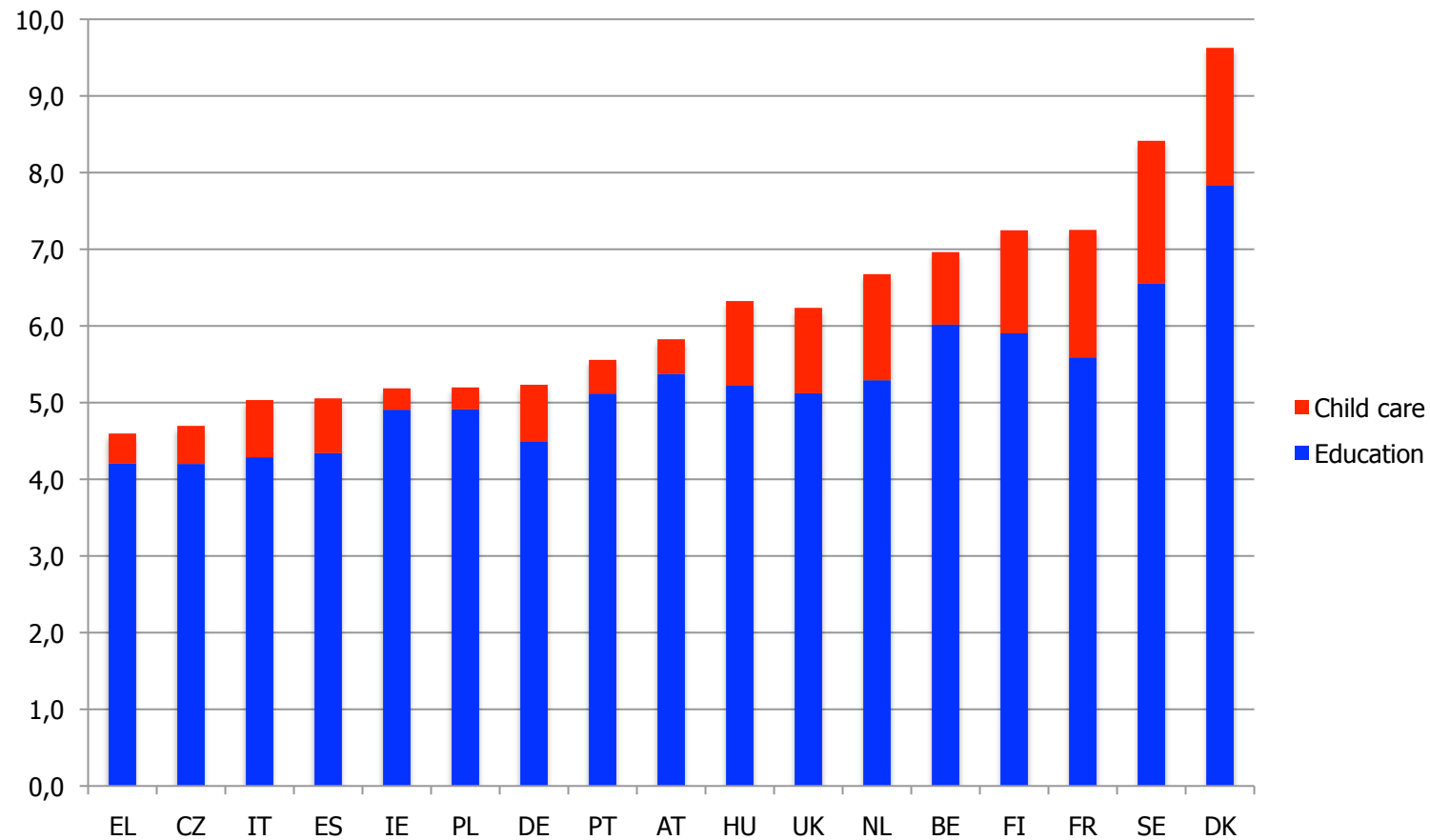

## Interactions affecting working time and work-life-balance

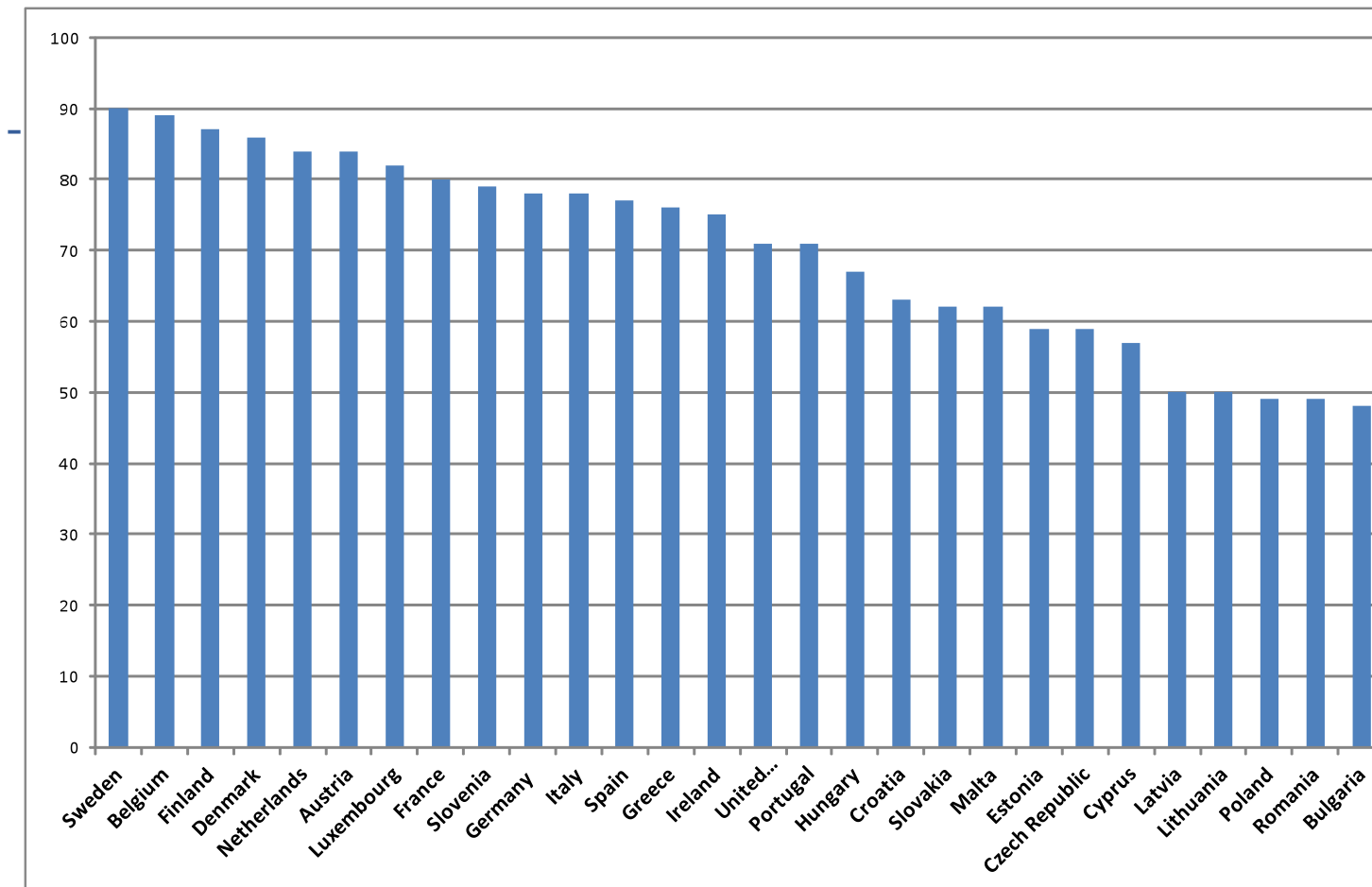


## Public expenditure for education + child care (% of GDP)



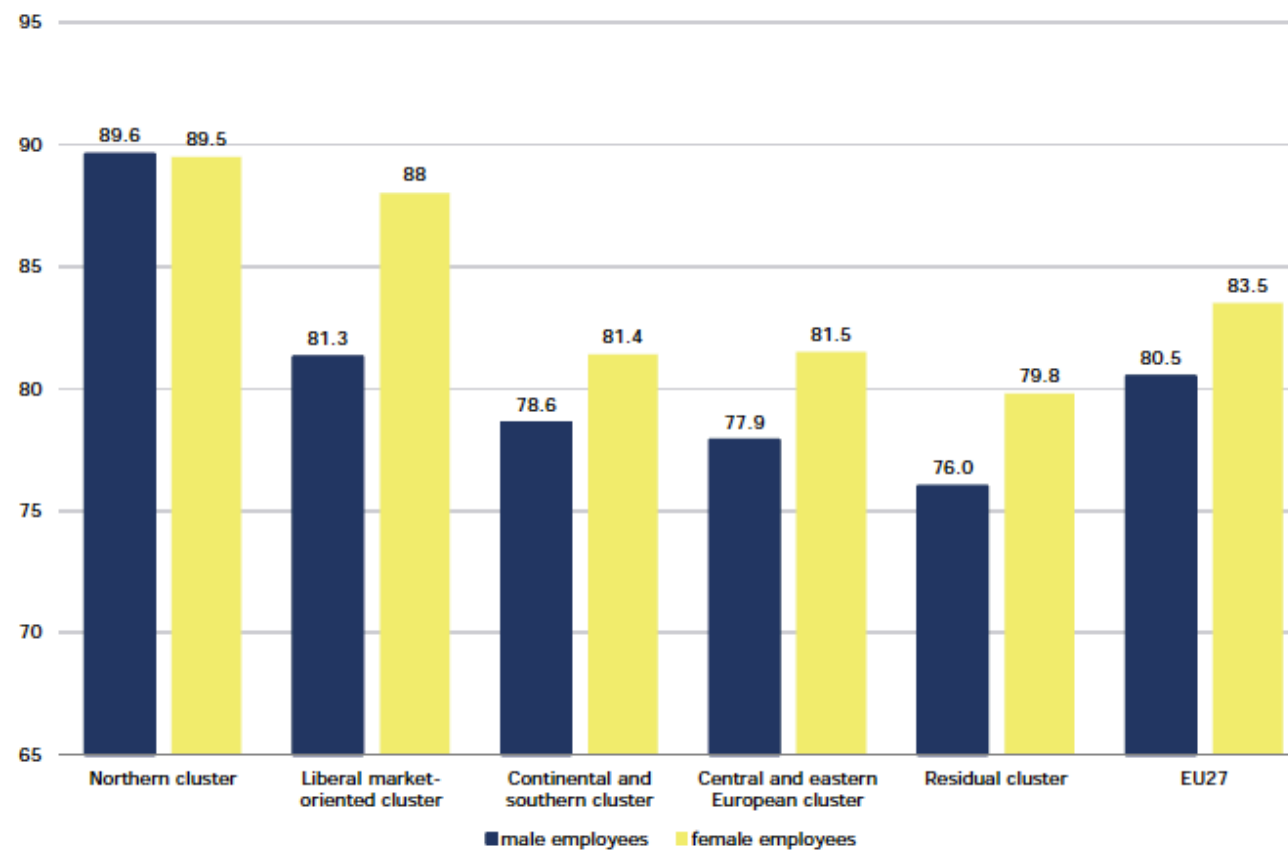
