#### 1. Introduction

The monitoring and evaluation of the Your first EURES job (YfEj) preparatory action relied to a large extent on data provided by the YfEj beneficiaries until **2013Q4**. Despite our continuous efforts to support project beneficiaries with data provision, some of them failed to deliver the requested data. A comparison between the data provided to us and the data included in the final report to the European Commission, revealed that the Provincia di Roma supplied cumulative data instead of quarterly data. Because of the divergent data collection methods and registration mechanisms of the various YfEj project beneficiaries, we cannot exclude the possibility that projects supply under or overestimated figures.

Given the corrected figures from Provincia di Roma, some data have been revised as set out below under sections 2 to 5. However, the **general conclusions of this evaluation remain unaffected by this revision.** This erratum includes an overview of the revised tables and graphs. Also some of the statements with regard to effectiveness and efficiency have been reformulated.

### 2. Implications for key performance indicators

Because the numbers reported by the Provincia di Roma were cumulative from the start of the project until the moment of reporting, the results achieved in one quarter were counted again in each subsequent quarter. This caused an overestimation of each indicator in the final report of the evaluation. The table below presents the totals for the key performance indicators for this beneficiary at the end of the project implementation. The reported totals, the actual totals and the difference are shown.

## 3. Development of placements (effectiveness)<sup>1</sup>


The figure below shows the development of the total number of placements over time, based on the revised numbers. The Italian project (IT) has been able to reach only 44% of its target at hardly one month before the termination of the project. This indicator shows the lowest target achievement trend of the first call projects (IT, DK1, DE, ES)<sup>2</sup>.


# Revised graph presented in the technical annexes of the final report, 2012 - 2013 Progress Measurement Review: April 2014 - Number of placements and target achievement per project



## 5. Average placement cost (efficiency)<sup>4</sup>

Based on the placements achieved and the budget used to finance them, the average placement cost per project amounts to € 1.592. The table below shows the revised average placement costs.
