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SUMMARY RECORD OF THE 4TH MEETING OF THE EXPERT GROUP FOR LAND TRANSPORT SECURITY

HELD IN BRUSSELS ON 29 APRIL 2014

On the 29 April 2014, the fourth meeting of the Land Transport Security Expert Group (LANDSEC) took place in Brussels. 27 representatives from the law enforcement and transport ministries of 20 Member States attended as well as 22 representatives from 20 stakeholder organisations.

There were two presentations related to the expertise at Member States levels, one by Germany, ("crisis management structures and procedures); and one by the UK, (Presentation of the "Risk Audit Matrix (RAM)". Two studies were also presented, financed by the EU Framework Program (FP7), one called "from Counteract to SECURED " showing the progress made in techniques to support the decision making process of evaluating risks and adopting counter measures. Counteract has been the first model in risk assessment under FP6 which has been specifically transport oriented; and Secur Ed (FP7) standing for Secured Urban Transport – European Demonstration is still ongoing.

Commission reported the results of the Informal Working group on Metal theft organised on 21th February.
