A minimum of three meetings of the expert group were envisaged: -Early April 2012 - presentation of work by Eurydice to date + initial discussions on options for presenting an overview of conditions for learning mobility ("mobility scoreboard") -Autumn 2012 - Review of progress and definition of possible options for a "mobility scoreboard" -February 2013 - Discussion of ways forward on basis of finalised study

Selection Procedure (members)

Via the Education Committee, the Commission invited Member States to propose, on a voluntary basis, experts on mobility issues to represent them, with a view to creating a group of six to eight experts to support the study. The intention to limit the number of experts to (around) eight was based on the need to establish a workable expert group that could assist efficiently and effectively with implementation of the study. This intention was made clear in the Commission's invitation to the Education Committee to propose experts. In practice, seven Member States nominated experts. As such, the issue of further selection of experts from the pool of those proposed did not arise.

Internal Rules of Procedure

The expert group operates on an informal basis.

Other

The Council Recommendation of 7 June 2011 "Youth on the Move – promoting the learning mobility of young people" (10545/11) recommends that Member States: "Support - on a voluntary basis - work on the feasibility of creating a methodological framework for monitoring progress in promoting, and removing obstacles to, learning mobility, based on a preparatory study carried out by the Eurydice network with the assistance of experts from the Member States and making full use of existing sources of data and information"(point 11a, p.14) . As indicated in the Recommendation, the intention is that the preparatory study should be carried out "with the assistance of experts from the Member States". In its "non-paper" of February 2011, the Commission suggested that this should be "a sub-group composed of a limited number of Member State representatives on a voluntary basis [who] could support the work of this study". In practical terms, this will entail reviewing and providing input in relation to the variables, methodological framework and feasibility of developing a comparative "mobility scoreboard". It could also involve, potential support, where necessary, for the national information gathering phase and reviewing the outputs of the study with a view to informing future reporting on the issues covered by the Recommendation. The duration of the Expert Group will be 18 months
