2-BE-SAFE, officially started on January 15th 2009, is a focused research collaborative project co-funded by European Commission under the Seventh Framework Programme, Theme 7 – Sustainable Surface Transport.

Its main objective is to target behavioural and ergonomics research to develop countermeasures for enhancing Powered Two Wheeler (PTW), riders safety, including research on crash causes and human errors, and the world's first naturalistic riding study involving instrumented PTWs.

It involves 29 partners in 14 different countries in Europe, Israel and Australia, divided among research and academic institutes, end-users associations and industrial partners.
