With regards to question 1 do the benefits outweigh the cost. The answer must be yes! and should not be limited to the age of vehicles.

We manufacture rear view mirrors and have looked at the option of fitting new radius glass to exsisting mirrors, this could be achieved if there is a reduction in the field of vision required under the directive, This would defeat the objective as from a SAFETY point by placing a restriction on the field of vision required.

why reduce the field of vision when there are already products in the market that have been tried and approved to meet the new requirements. Such as additional mirrors or camera systems.

why not included the option of changing mirror glass in exsisting mirrors only if they meet the field of vision required or fitting a additional device.
