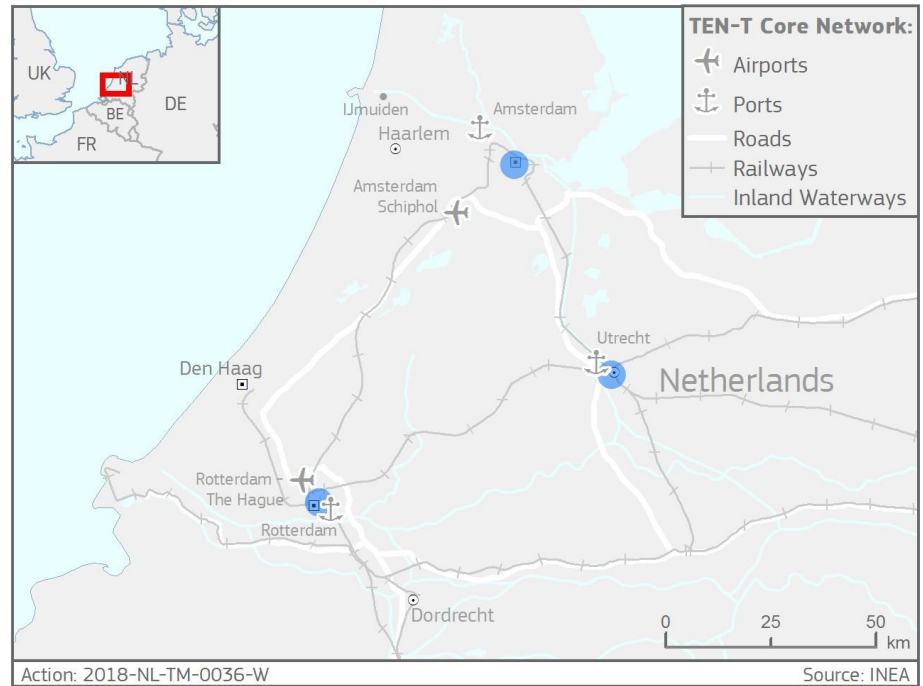

Regulation (EU) No 1315/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 11 December 2013 on Union guidelines for the development of the trans-European transport network defines the priorities for multimodal transport infrastructure development. In particular, the Regulation establishes that in the promotion of projects of common interest related to multimodal transport infrastructure, priority shall be given to removing the main technical and administrative barriers to multimodal transport. The Regulation also prescribes that Member States shall ensure in a fair and non-discriminatory way that transport modes are connected in passenger stations, in order to allow multimodal transport of passengers. In order to reach these objectives, public intervention to support targeted investments is considered necessary. The Action is part of a Global Project (“Actieplan Fietsparkeren bij Stations”), coordinated by the Dutch Ministry of Infrastructure and Water Management, which foresees the realisation of 143,500 extra bike storage places near 47 railway stations in the Netherlands between 2012 – 2020, and beyond until 2030, with a total budget of up to EUR 550 million. After a mid-term evaluation done in 2015, it became clear that despite the reserved budget, the shortage of parking places for bikes near railway stations would have
