


Timeline

From the Inception Impact Assessment... to the Impact Assessment

- 4 areas covered: welfare at farm level (including phasing out of cages), during transport, at the time of killing, animal welfare labelling.
- 9 common problems + specific problems
- List of policy options envisaged
- Public feedback gathered between 6 July and 24 August 2021

Transport

- Space allowances, travel times and travel conditions
- Live animal exports to non-EU countries
- Unweaned and other vulnerable animals
- Better monitoring and enforcement by introducing new technologies
- Cats and dogs
- Means of transports, adapted to new technologies





Farm level

- Five domains
- Duty-of-care
- A prohibition on cages/stalls
- Increased space allowances
- Mutilations
- Imported products of animal origin
- Animal welfare indicators
- Competence of animal handlers
- New species-specific AW requirements

European Citizens' Initiative « End the Cage Age »

- Commission's answer:
 - 2023 legislative proposal will include provisions to phasing out and finally prohibit the use of cages for all animal species and categories referred to in the ECI
 - The conditions of these phasing out (including the length of the transition period) will be determined based on EFSA opinions, the result of an impact assessment and a public consultation.

- Simplification






Animal welfare labelling

- Option 2: An EU animal welfare label, limited to cage/ non-cage systems
- Option 3: An EU animal welfare label, with key welfare criteria




Sentiment Analysis of EU Citizen feedback responses

Roadmap of future mandates to EFSA

- 26 October 2021: Commission sent roadmap to EFSA indicating its planned future mandates in the area of animal welfare, after 2023:
 - Beef cattle
 - Sheep and goats
 - Turkeys
 - Farmed salmon and trout; carp; sea bass; sea bream, European eel
 - Ducks, geese and quail
 - Horses
 - Minks, racoon dogs, foxes
 - Certain invertebrates such as decapods
