

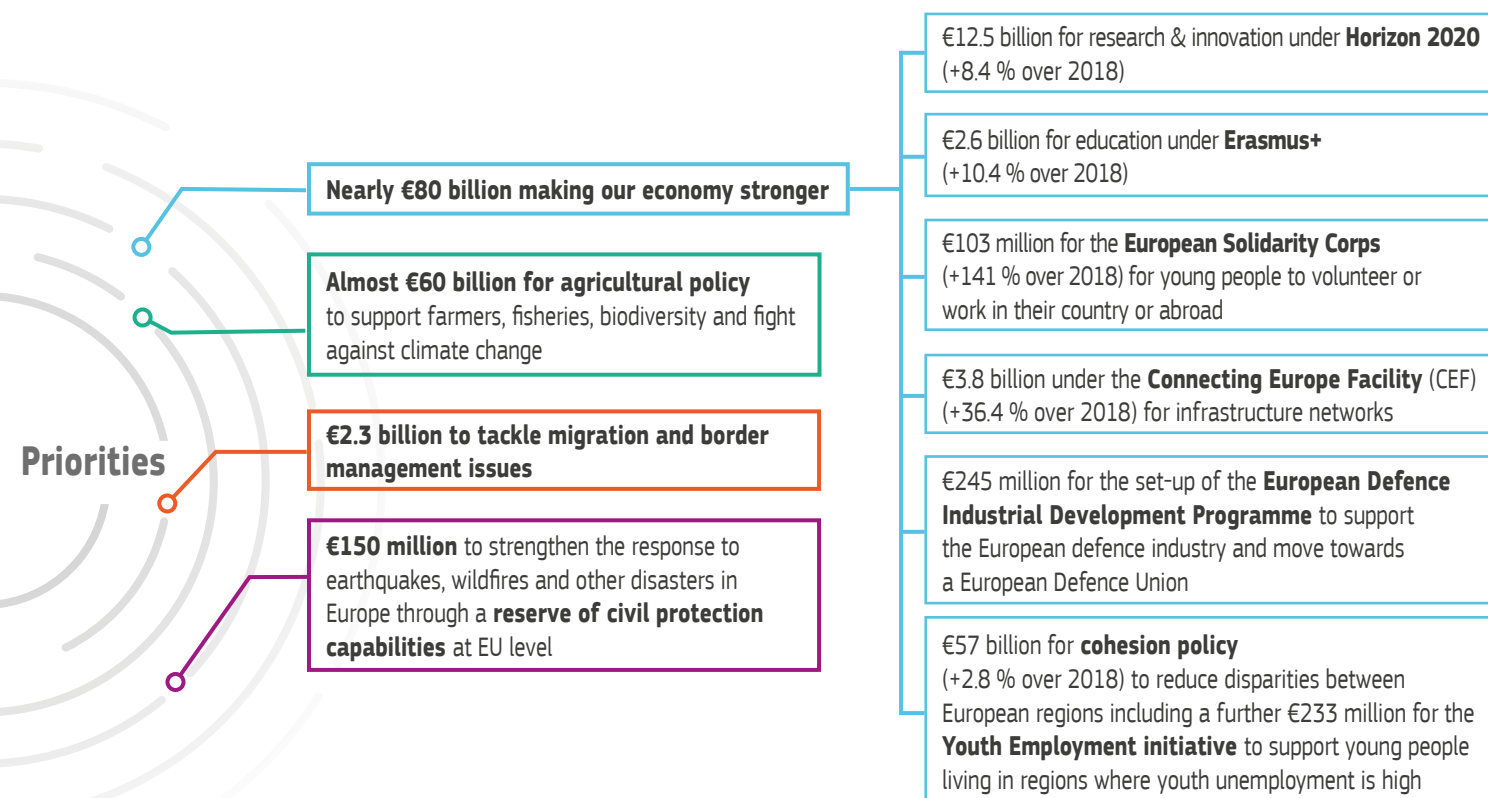
2019 DRAFT EU BUDGET

Continuity and delivery
for growth, solidarity, security

May 2018

On 23 May 2018, the Commission has adopted the 2019 draft EU Budget of €166 billion in commitments, corresponding to a 3 % increase over 2018, investing in a stronger and more resilient European economy and promoting solidarity and security on both sides of the EU's borders.

This budget is the sixth one under the current 2014-2020 long-term EU budget. It is designed to optimise funding for existing programmes as well as new initiatives and to boost European added value in line with the Juncker Commission's priorities.



We are proposing an ambitious budget that continues to support our priorities, in particular on investment, jobs, youth, migration, solidarity and security, and that delivers European added value for our citizens. We need stability for the EU and I look forward to reaching an agreement with Parliament and Council as soon as possible.

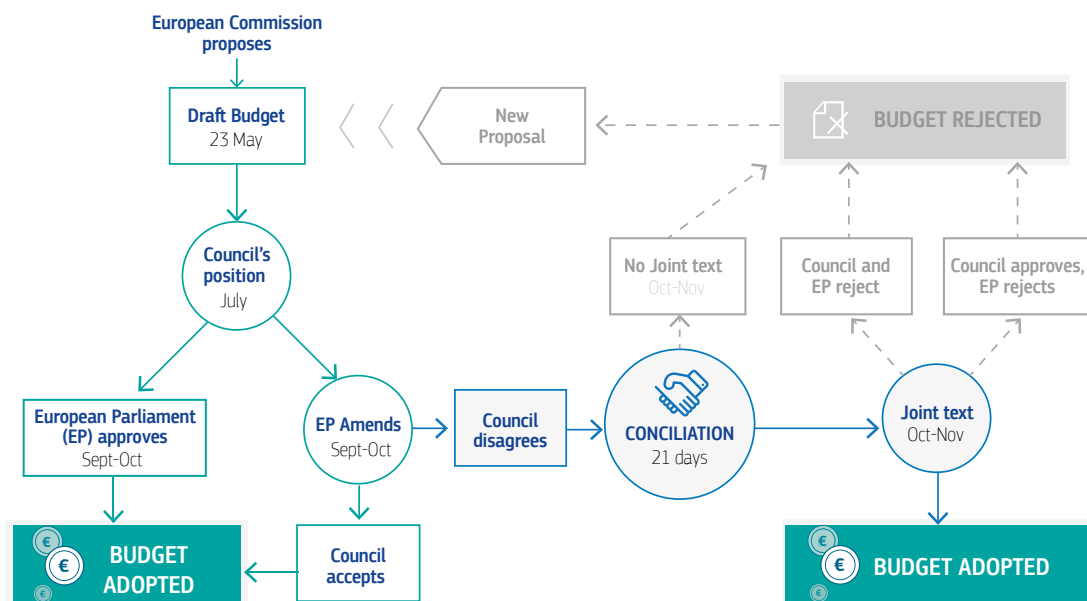
