European e-Justice Portal

This is a CEF funded Sector Specific Digital Service Infrastructures (DSIs). It deploys complex trans-European digital services based upon mature technical and organisational solutions in diverse areas.

The dematerialisation of legal procedures and the use of electronic means in the communication among all those involved in judicial activities are becoming more and more important for the efficient functioning of the judiciary in the Member States. The Member States and the European institutions are committed to building the European e-Justice system.

What is European e-Justice Portal about?

The European e-Justice Portal is a key element in the architecture of the European e-Justice system. The Portal is conceived as a one-stop-shop in the area of justice and, as such, operates as a decentralised platform for e-Justice services. To ensure its interactive services provide broad coverage, the Portal depends on Member States (or other national organisations) connecting to it.

E-Justice services include, for instance:

- The **Interconnection of Insolvency Registers**, that provides timely information to creditors and courts and helps prevent the opening of parallel insolvency proceedings.
- **Find a Lawyer** and its sibling project **Find a Notary**, that allow citizens and legal practitioners to easily locate a lawyer or a notary speaking their language throughout the EU.

The Digital Service Infrastructure was established to grow the coverage of the European e-Justice Portal's services by helping more Member States connect to it.

The European e-Justice Portal has been available for use since 2010.

What is the Policy Context?

The Portal continues to be developed by the European Commission together with the Member States in accordance with the [Strategy on European e-Justice 2014-2018](#) and the [Multiannual European e-Justice Action Plan 2014-2018](#).
