

#### WHAT WE ARE PROPOSING

- Emergency declaration at EU-level to ensure EU measures
- **EU Health Task Force** and training for healthcare staff
- Stronger EU guidance on common response measures and implementation responsibilities
- State-of-the-art **monitoring** of epidemiological situation
- Risk assessment based on common data
- A new authority to **develop and procure biomedical and other solutions** to enable better testing and contact tracing
- Harmonised EU, national and regional **preparedness and response plans**
- Regular **auditing and stress-testing** of national preparedness plans
- **Monitoring of medicines** and medical devices supply
- The new authority to **develop and procure biomedical products** will ensure fast response to urgent needs in health emergencies
