The EU is working with NATO on a new EU-NATO Joint Declaration to be presented before the end of 2021

In future, the EU also needs to be able to do more on its own:

- To provide stability in our neighbourhood
- To deal with new and emerging threats; hybrid/cyber attacks, the arms race in space
- Because Europe is a unique security provider, with a long history of peacebuilding

The EU and NATO need to invest in our joint partnership and to draw on each side's unique strength.





We have started to develop a European Defence ecosystem. But what we need is the European Defence Union.

Europe needs to:



improve collective decision-making and intelligence cooperation



consider its own joint Situational Awareness Centre



improve interoperability we are investing in common platforms, from fighter jets to drones to cyber



consider waiving VAT when buying Europeanmade defence equipment



a European Cyber Defence Policy, including legislation on common standards. under a new European Cyber Resilience Act



Presidents Macron and von der Leyen will convene a European Defence Summit in Toulouse under the French EU Presidency - first half of 2022
