EU-CANADA TRADE AGREEMENT

CETA has helped increase EU goods exports to Canada by **26%**.

EU exports to Canada support **700,000 European jobs**, 70,000 more than before CETA.

44% more small- and medium-sized enterprises export to Canada now than they did before CETA.



CETA has improved security of supply in raw materials, energy and food.

Imports of base metals from Canada **went up 143%**.

Imports of minerals **went up by 131%**.



Energy imports from Canada **grew by 70%**.

Fertiliser imports from Canada **grew by 225%**.

CETA is a highly sustainable trade deal, with strong climate and labour commitments.

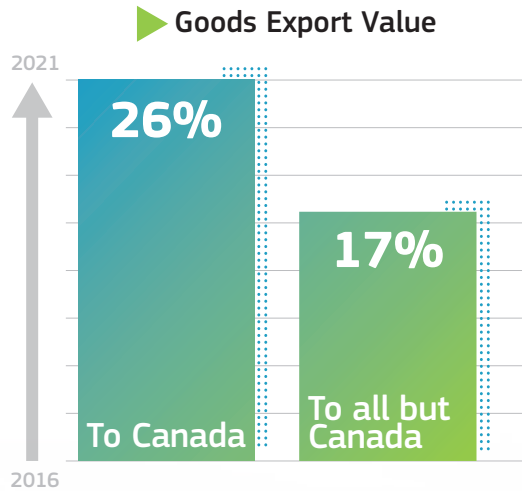
Total bilateral trade in environmental goods **grew by 27%** between 2016 and 2019.



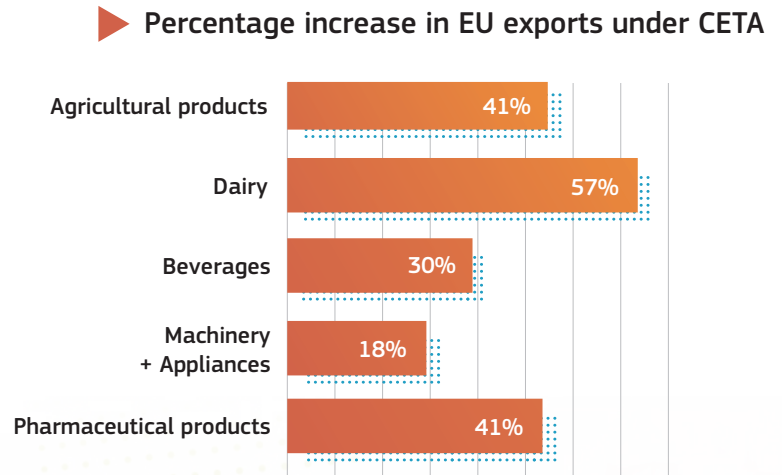


TRADE BOOMS UNDER CETA

CETA SUPPORTS ECONOMIC SUCCESS IN MEMBER STATES



German exports of ships and boats to Canada **have grown by 263%**.



French exports of bread, pastry and cakes to Canada **have grown by 141%**.



Greek exports of aluminium doors and windows to Canada **have grown by 720%**.



Bulgarian exports of preserved peaches and nectarines to Canada **have grown by 824%**.



Polish exports of milled products to Canada **have grown by 1,065%**.



Czech exports of grand pianos to Canada **have grown by 334%**.



Cypriot exports of fire extinguishers to Canada **have grown by 429%**.



Irish exports of meat products to Canada **have grown by 603%**.
