What we want to achieve


Building on existing EU tools, including the extended mandate of the **European Medicines Agency** (EMA), the creation of the **Health Emergency Preparedness and Response Authority** (HERA) and the **pharmaceutical reform**, the Commission is taking additional action to:



- manage critical shortages of medicines;
- improve the security of supply in the EU for the coming winter and beyond;
- > reinforce the industrial policy pillar of the European Health Union.

How we plan to do this

IMMEDIATE AND SHORT-TERM ACTIONS TO MITIGATE CRITICAL SHORTAGES



- A Union list of critical medicines: to be published by the end of 2023.
- Make use of **regulatory flexibilities** where needed.
- EU guidance on procurement: to be issued by early 2024 to strengthen security of supply.
- Accelerating and anticipating the **pharmaceutical reform** in cooperation with the Member States.




STRUCTURAL MEASURES FOR THE MID-TERM AND LONG-TERM

A Critical Medicines Alliance to be operational in early 2024. The Alliance will:

- - Coordinate public procurement practices at EU level.
 - Explore how to **diversify global supply chains through strategic partnerships**.
 - Boost Europe's capacity to produce and innovate in the manufacturing of critical medicines and ingredients in coordinated way.
 - Develop a common strategic approach to medicines stockpiling in the EU.
 - Help leverage and align EU and national funding.

INTERNATIONAL PARTNERSHIPS FOR SUPPLY

- A **network of international partners** to address supply chain resilience.
 - Strategic partnerships with third countries for the production of critical medicines.



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
