

COMMUNICATION ON EU'S EASTERN REGIONS BORDERING RUSSIA, BELARUS AND UKRAINE

Strong regions for a safe Europe

February 2026

With this Communication, the European Commission sets out a plan to make Europe's regions bordering Russia, Belarus and Ukraine more secure, resilient and attractive places to live and work. This concerns 9 Member States: Finland, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Slovakia, Hungary, Romania and Bulgaria.

Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine has severely affected people and communities



Security threats are rising:
Hybrid attacks, disinformation, weaponised migration, sabotage from Russia and Belarus

Economic disruption:

Collapse of cross-border trade, reduced investment, stagnating housing markets, pressure on SMEs and supply chains



Strain on local services:
Limited financial capacity of municipalities, underfunded services, and increased pressure from displaced persons



Demographic decline:
Emigration, ageing populations and shortages of workers in key sectors such as healthcare and education

- Increased EU funding for **defence, border management and internal security** in next EU budget
