- Processing and aquaculture included




INDICATORS

- •30 indicators mostly Environmental, Economic, Social and Governance such as
 - state of stocks
 - employment and wages
 - incomes and profitabilities



FISHERIES





ENVIRONMENT IN 2022

- Only 8 out of 136 stocks are likely to be healthy by 2022
- •94 % of stocks fished above maximum sustainable yield agreed in Johannesburg in 2002
- •Moving down from 80% of EU stocks overfished to lower figure, but far from 25% global average



ENVIRONMENT IN 2022

 Moving down from 30 % of fish stocks threatened by collapse to lower figure

 Question: how much lower is good enough result for us?



ECONOMIC SITUATION IN 2022

- Spiral of decline
- Financial and economic viability of majority of fleets under threat
- Overcapacity prevents fleets from improving financial performance




ECONOMIC SITUATION IN 2022

- Shrinking economic returns will bring cut down on costs by compromising safety and hiring non EU crews
- 10 vessels trying to catch fish that should be caught by 5 vessels
- Impact on marine environment and increased discards

SOCIAL SITUATION IN 2022

- fleets relying on public aid
- IFREMER study: aids granted to fishing sector have supported biologically and economically unsustainable fleet and
- aids create social unrest







Poor economic performance, low resilience to external pressures

SOCIAL SITUATION IN 2022

- Fleet overcapacity kills jobs
- Weak economic performance prevents increases in wages
- Wages well below national average



SOCIAL SITUATION IN 2022

- Low attractiveness of profession
- Coastal communities declining

- Tough and difficult decisions are needed to prevent slow death of fishing sector
