- (1) On 07.04.2011, the European Commission received notification of a proposed concentration pursuant to Article 4 of the Merger Regulation by which the undertaking ZMB (Schweiz) AG (Switzerland) belonging to the group Gazprom (Russia) acquires within the meaning of Article 3(1)(b) of the Merger Regulation control of the whole of the undertaking GWH Gashandel GmbH (Austria) by way of purchase of shares².
- 2. The business activities of the undertakings concerned are:
 - for ZMB (Schweiz) AG: trading of natural gas
 - for Gazprom: vertically integrated group of undertakings mainly active in exploration, production, processing, transport and sale of natural gas

- 1. After examination of the notification, the European Commission has concluded that the notified operation falls within the scope of the Merger Regulation and of paragraph 5(d) of the Commission Notice on a simplified procedure for treatment of certain concentrations under Council Regulation (EC) No 139/2004³.
- 2. For the reasons set out in the Notice on a simplified procedure, the European Commission has decided not to oppose the notified operation and to declare it compatible with the internal market and with the EEA Agreement. This decision is adopted in application of Article 6(1)(b) of the Merger Regulation.
