**Subject: Case M.7486 – INGRAM MICRO/ ANOV EXPANSION
Commission decision pursuant to Article 6(1)(b) of Council Regulation (EC)
No 139/2004¹ and Article 57 of the Agreement on the European Economic Area²**

1. On 22.12.2014, the European Commission received notification of a proposed concentration pursuant to Article 4 of the Merger Regulation by which the undertaking Ingram Micro (UK) Ltd., a wholly owned subsidiary of Ingram Micro Inc. (USA) ('Ingram Micro') acquires within the meaning of Article 3(1)(b) of the Merger Regulation control of the whole of the undertaking ANOV Expansion SAS (France) and its subsidiaries, except its Spanish subsidiaries ('Anovo'), by way of purchase of shares.³
2. The business activities of the undertakings concerned are:
 - for Ingram Micro: distribution and logistics services for IT and other electronic products,
 - for Anovo: logistics services for mobility products, consumer electronic products and other electronic products.
3. After examination of the notification, the European Commission has concluded that the notified operation falls within the scope of the Merger Regulation and of paragraph 5(c)i,

c(ii) and 6 of the Commission Notice on a simplified procedure for treatment of certain concentrations under Council Regulation (EC) No 139/2004.⁴

4. For the reasons set out in the Notice on a simplified procedure, the European Commission has decided not to oppose the notified operation and to declare it compatible with the internal market and with the EEA Agreement. This decision is adopted in application of Article 6(1)(b) of the Merger Regulation and Article 57 of the EEA Agreement.
