**Subject: Case M.8089 – RANDSTAD / AUSY
Commission decision pursuant to Article 6(1)(b) of Council Regulation (EC)
No 139/2004¹ and Article 57 of the Agreement on the European Economic Area²**

1. On 22 July 2016, the European Commission received notification of a proposed concentration pursuant to Article 4 of the Merger Regulation by which the undertaking Randstad Holding n.v. ("Randstad" of the Netherlands), through its wholly-owned subsidiary Randstad France S.A.S.U., acquires within the meaning of Article 3(1)(b) of the Merger Regulation control of the whole of the undertaking Ausy S.A. ("Ausy" of France) by way of a voluntary cash tender offer.³
2. The business activities of the undertakings concerned are:
 - for Randstad: temporary employment services, permanent employment services and other human resources related services;
 - for Ausy: provision of consultancy and engineering services with a focus on advanced technologies.

3. After examination of the notification, the European Commission has concluded that the notified operation falls within the scope of the Merger Regulation and of paragraph 5(c) of the Commission Notice on a simplified procedure for treatment of certain concentrations under Council Regulation (EC) No 139/2004.⁴
4. For the reasons set out in the Notice on a simplified procedure, the European Commission has decided not to oppose the notified operation and to declare it compatible with the internal market and with the EEA Agreement. This decision is adopted in application of Article 6(1)(b) of the Merger Regulation and Article 57 of the EEA Agreement.
