## **M.10733 CMA CGM / GEFCO**

### **SECTION 1.2**

#### **Description of the concentration**

On 17 June 2022, CMA CGM S.A. (“CMA CGM”), a French company headquartered in Marseille, notified to the Commission a proposed concentration pursuant to Article 4 of Council Regulation (EC) no 139/2004, by which it acquires, within the meaning of Article 3(1)(b) of the Council Regulation, via a share purchase, sole control over GEFCO SA (“GEFCO”), a French-based company.

CMA CGM is a significant worldwide player in sea transportation, active in container liner shipping (notably on all main trade lanes to/from the EEA) and port terminal services. Through its subsidiary CEVA Logistics, CMA CGM is also active worldwide in freight forwarding services (including air, ocean and ground freight forwarding) in and contract logistics through its subsidiary CEVA Logistics. In the EEA, CEVA Logistics is active in Austria, Belgium, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Iceland, Norway and Liechtenstein.

GEFCO is active in freight forwarding and contract logistics, with a focus on finished vehicles logistics. GEFCO operates mainly in Europe (and notably in France but also in Austria, the Baltics, Benelux, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia and Spain) but is also active in the rest of the world (South America, the United States, Asia and Australia).
