Communication from the Commission to the European Parliament and the Council Implementation of Article 290 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union (Senate Press no. K 093/07)

The Senate

I.

1. Is aware

of the significant institutional impact of the new rules laid down in the Lisbon Treaty as regards the adoption of delegated acts by the Commission;

2. **Reminds**

of the risks of the trend of basic legislative acts containing only a framework regulation, which would lead to an increased number of delegated acts, the adoption process of which is less transparent than the one of the basic acts;

II.

1. Supports

the horizontal regulation of the application of Article 290 TFEU, especially as regards time limits, provision of information and procedures of raising objections and revocation of the delegation;

2. Welcomes

the Commission's intention to systematically consult experts from the member states' bodies responsible for the implementation of delegated acts after their adoption and invites the Commission to retain this intention during the subsequent interinstitutional negotiations on the horizontal regulation of the rules and basic principles applicable to the delegation of power;

3. Invites

the Commission to work to ensure transparent environment for the adoption of delegated acts, including setting highly transparent procedures for informal consultations of experts from the member states, that would enable the legislator efficient scrutiny of this process;

III.

1. Requests

the government to inform the Senate about the way this position was taken into account and to provide the Senate with information on further proceeding of negotiations;

2. Authorises

the President of the Senate to forward this resolution to the European Commission.
