Communication from the Commission to the European Parliament, the Council, the European Economic and Social Committee and the Committee of the Regions - Digitalising of the energy system - EU Action Plan /Council Code 13778/22, COM(2022) 552 final/

#### **Conclusions of the Resolution:**

Committee for European Affairs

- 1. **takes note of** the Communication from the Commission on the Digitalising of the energy system EU Action Plan;
- 2. **supports** the Government's Framework Position of the Czech Republic on this document;
- 3. **supports** the adoption of this document following the Green Deal for Europe and REPowerEU documents;
- 4. **welcomes** the digital and sustainable transformation of our energy system within the European system as a way to gradually end the EU's dependence on Russian fossil fuels and to ensure affordable energy access;
- 5. **draws attention** to the vague wording contained in the document and to the possible administrative burden for member states and entrepreneurs that the measures may accompany;
- 6. **draws attention** to the need to follow up on the current status of related initiatives and structures in order to avoid duplication of activities;
- 7. **draws attention** to the high energy demand of new technologies and the need to find the most energy-efficient solutions given the impact of digital products on the environment;
- 8. **supports** activities leading to increasing cyber security and strengthening the resilience of critical infrastructure;
- 9. **supports** the development of the knowledge of qualified professionals as well as the education of all citizens in the field of digital tools and technologies;
- 10. **authorizes** the Chairman of the Committee on European Affairs to forward this resolution to the President of the European Commission **in the framework of the political dialogue**.
