Delivered on the 30th session held on 12th October 2022

On the package attracting skilled and talented workers into the EU

The Senate

I.

1. In general supports

the Commission's aim to make the European Union more appealing as regards its ability to attract foreign skilled workers;

2. Perceives that

ensuring adequate personnel resources in some particular sectors is and will be a challenge in a number of Member States; the Czech Government would welcome, in particular, foreign workers for long-term care and medical staff at this time;

3. Supports

the Government's position, i.e. the Government's framework positions on the legislative proposals, and agrees that Member States should have the possibility to adjust their policies and programs relating the labour migration based on the needs and state of their economy, labour market and current developments in the country;

4. Also points out

that it will be necessary to clarify and redraft some of the provisions of the proposals during the legislative process; for example, it is not clear from the proposed recast of the longterm residents directive whether the long-term residence status shall confer a right to reside in a Member State in a situation where the foreigner's national residence permit is revoked; in this sense, it should be clarified that long-term residence status is a status, not a residence permit as such;

II.

1. Requests

the Government to inform the Senate no later than on 31st January 2023 about the further development of negotiations as regards the proposals in question and about the way this Resolution was taken into account;

2. Authorises

the President of the Senate to forward this Resolution to the European Commission.
