Dear President,

The Commission would like to thank the Bundesrat for its Opinion on the proposal for a Regulation establishing a centralised system for the identification of Member States holding conviction information on third country nationals and stateless persons (TCN) to supplement and support the European Criminal Records Information System (ECRIS-TCN system) and amending Regulation (EU) No 1077/2011, {COM(2015) 344 final}.

This proposal forms part of a broader package of ambitious measures designed to improve the Union's security architecture as set out in the European Agenda on Security and the Commission's Communication of 6 April 2016 on Stronger and Smarter Information Systems for Borders and Security¹. It is also part of the legislative priorities for 2017 as agreed by the European Parliament, the Council and the Commission in December 2016 in their joint declaration of 13 December 2016².

The proposal strives to close loopholes in the exchange of information regarding convicted third country nationals. It will establish a centralised system located at the European Agency for the operational management of Large-Scale IT Systems in the area of freedom, security and justice (eu-LISA), providing a search mechanism to identify Member State(s) holding information on a particular convicted third country national. Information on former convictions of persons will lead to better informed and adequate decisions in criminal proceedings and other security relevant fields of decision making.

The Commission welcomes the Bundesrat's broad support for the aims of the proposal. Due note has been taken of the Bundesrat's explanations with regard to the need to not only include pseudonyms and alias names into the system, but also other deviating identity information, such as different transcripts of a third country national's name and surname. Variations in name spelling can indeed lead to misleading responses by the system.
