It is also very important that the proposed more stringent requirements for organic farming do not become a risk factor for the continuity of organic production and trigger abandonment of organic production by farmers. In particular, we stress and oppose the requirement to practise only organic production in the entire holding on the basis of the fact that a large part of farms in Lithuania and some other EU Member States practise mixed production (crop cultivation and livestock farming) and hold land on lease.

In particular, we stress and oppose the requirement to practise only organic production in the entire holding on the basis of the fact that a large part of farms in Lithuania and some other EU Member States practise mixed production (crop cultivation and livestock farming) and hold land on lease.
