Dear Chair,

The Commission would like to thank the Assembleia da República for its Opinion on the proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on the European Agency for the operational management of large-scale IT systems in the area of freedom, security and justice, and amending Regulation (EC) 1987/2006 and Council Decision 2007/533/JHA and repealing Regulation (EU) 1077/2011, {COM(2017) 352 final}.

This proposal forms part of a broader package of measures designed for a better functioning of the current European Union information systems, for the creation of necessary new systems, their interoperability and for enhancing information exchange. These measures are key to ensure security, efficient migration and border management in the European Union.

By proposing a new mandate for the European Agency for the operational management of large-scale IT Systems in the area of freedom, security and justice (eu-LISA), the Commission is delivering on the European Agendas on Security and Migration.

The purpose of the proposal is to improve the functioning of eu-LISA and strengthening its role to ensure that its mandate meets the current challenges at Union level in the area of freedom, security and justice.

The Commission is pleased that the Assembleia da República shares the view that eu-LISA's mandate should be extended and aligned to the principles of the Joint Statement of the European Parliament and of the Council on decentralised agencies, the Framework Financial Regulation and the new legal framework on data protection.
