Dear President,

The Commission would like to thank the Romanian Senate for its Opinion on the proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and the Council on mutual recognition of protection measures in civil matters {COM(2011) 276 final}.

The Commission welcomes the positive assessment on the compliance of the proposal with the principles of subsidiarity and proportionality.

With regard to the remarks on the content of the proposed act, the Commission would like to make the following comments:

The primary objective of the Commission is to ensure that all types of protection measures are recognised throughout the European Union and so all victims would benefit from cross-border protection. For this reason, the Commission has proposed that the draft act should have a broad scope of application and cover also protection measures ordered in default of appearance (so called ex parte measures) when the legal order of the Member State of origin provides for such type of measure.

The Commission thus welcomes that the Senate is favourable to including ex parte measures in the scope of the draft act. This, in the Commission's view, would represent the right step forward for the cross-border protection of victims.

The Commission would also like to reassure the Senate that mutual recognition of ex parte measures would be accompanied by robust safeguards on procedural rights.

I hope that this clarification addresses the suggestion expressed in the Senate's Opinion and look forward to continuing our political dialogue in the future.
