SUMMARY

of the Opinion on "the Energy Efficiency and its contribution to energy security and the 2030 Framework for climate and energy policy" COM(2014) 520 final

The Chamber of Deputies notices that a continuous concrete preoccupation continues to exist, at the level of the Union, for decoupling the economic growth from the energy consumption, by increasing the energy efficiency, which is beneficial both for the European Union and Romania.

At the same time, it recommends the European Commission to analyze, more profoundly, the relation between the energy efficiency and the reduction of phonic pollution, in order to recommend synergic and coherent measures in the two fields.

The European Commission is expected to establish a firm deadline so that the Member States may gradually eliminate the subventions for the energy from renewable sources. It is recommended to have a close examination - for each Member State - of the costs for gas emissions reduction, based on detailed impact evaluations.

At the same time, additional clarifications are necessary regarding the operation way of the European system of governance in the field of renewable energy.
