OPINION

of the ROMANIAN SENATE

regarding the COMMUNICATION FROM THE COMMISSION TO THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND THE COUNCIL Eighth biannual report on the functioning of the Schengen area 1 May - 10 December 2015 - COM (2015) 675 final

The Romanian Senate examined the COMMUNICATION FROM THE COMMISSION TO THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND THE COUNCIL Eighth biannual report on the functioning of the Schengen area 1 May - 10 December 2015 – according to the provisions of the Treaty of Lisbon (Protocol no. 1).

Taking into account the report of April 26, 2016 of the permanent Committee for European Affairs, the Plenum of the Senate, during its session of May 3, 2016, decided as follows:

I. The following are noted:

- a. The permanent and growing concern of EU to manage most effectively migration flow to internal and external borders;
- b. The support for strengthening Schengen framework by:
 - 1. SIS;
 - 2. Issuing alerts for performing direct or specific checks;
 - 3. Completing an initial set of common risk indicators regarding foreign fighters.
- c. Compliance of Romania in
 - 1. Taking over the incident provisions and their responsible application;
 - 2. Ensuring legislative harmonization;
 - 3. Respecting its obligations as a Schengen member state, even if due to international political reasons, Romania has not been granted this status.

II. The following are considered crucial:

- a. The permanent concern to eliminate the deficiencies in the implementation of the EU acquis;
- b. Keeping the temporary nature of the reintroduction of internal border controls;
- c. Optimal implementation of the proportionality depending on the level of threats;
- d. Keeping the responsibility of Member States legal regulations at internal borders.
