Communication from the Commission to the European Parliament, the Council, the European Economic and Social Committee and the Committee of the Regions European Skills Agenda for sustainable competitiveness, social fairness and resilience

The Chamber of Deputies supports the objectives of the European Skills Agenda as a basis for preparing the necessary qualifications in the workplace and stimulating the dual transition, both environmentally and digitally.

The Chamber of Deputies recalls the need to continue efforts to improve digital training, self-taught, extracurricular and connected learning.

The Chamber of Deputies recommends:

- the establishment of a comprehensive system of indicators to assess the work of the European Commission in the development and implementation of the measures set out in the Agenda;
- a coherent link between guidelines aimed at improving early education with the need for family presence;
- analysis of obstacles to an active market and diversification of education and training services;
- revitalising the Digital Skills and Jobs Coalition;
- the acceptance for financing of commercial, non-profit and social entreprises in the supply of skills;
- the adoption of horizontal themes in funding programmes that support the aquisition of skills and capacities.

The Chamber of Deputies also draws attention to the need to develop a solid European culture of concern for all members of a community.
