Dear Presidents,

The Commission would like to thank the Congreso de los Diputados and the Senado for their Opinion on the proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council establishing a centralised system for the identification of Member States holding conviction information on third country nationals and stateless persons (TCN) to supplement and support the European Criminal Records Information System (ECRIS-TCN system) and amending Regulation (EU) No 1077/2011 {COM(2017)344 final}.

The proposal on the European Criminal Records Information System forms part of a broader package of measures designed to improve the Union's security architecture set out in the European Agenda on Security and the Commission's Communication of 6 April 2016 on Stronger and Smarter Information Systems for Borders and Security, {COM(2016) 205 final}. It is also part of the legislative priorities for 2017 as agreed by the European Parliament, the Council and the Commission in December 2016 in their Joint Declaration of 13 December 2016.

The Commission's proposal strives to close loopholes in the exchange of conviction information regarding convicted third country nationals. It will provide a search mechanism to identify the Member State(s) holding information on a particular convicted third country national. Information on former convictions of persons will lead to better informed and adequate decisions in criminal proceedings and other security relevant fields of decision making.
