The Commission would like to thank the Riksdag for its Opinion on the Green Paper "Lighting the Future – accelerating the deployment of innovative lighting technologies" {COM(2011) 889 final} and apologises for the delay in replying.

The Commission takes particular note of the following points made by the Rinksdag:

- The importance of energy efficient lighting solutions for the EU to jointly achieve the common goal of reducing energy consumption by 20 percent by 2020.
- The need to monitor the evolution lighting technology and market¹.
- The need to further develop common standards, invest in research and innovation and facilitate and encourage energy efficiency.
- The importance of continuing to monitor the issues raised with respect to possible effects of Solid State Lighting on consumers' health.
- The Riksdag's reminder of its reasoned opinion on the Commission's proposal for a Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council on Energy Efficiency {COM(2011) 370 final}, which is currently in the legislative process, under discussion by the European Parliament and Council.
