WiFi4EU

The **WiFi4EU initiative** promotes free access to Wi-Fi connectivity for citizens in public spaces including parks, squares, public buildings, libraries, health centres and museums in municipalities throughout Europe. It was built as a first-come, first-served voucher scheme whereby participating municipalities have been awarded €15,000 vouchers in order to implement open Wi-Fi networks. Following four calls for proposals (one call in 2018, 2 calls in 2019 and one call in 2020) a total amount of 8,802 vouchers has been awarded.

Four calls for proposals (one in 2018, two in 2019 and one in 2020) were open to provide financial assistance to municipalities across Europe to promote internet connectivity.

Municipalities that won a voucher had 18 months to deploy the networks, deadline which was extended to 32 months (for the calls in 2018 and 2019) and 24 months (for the call in 2020) in order to help municipalities strongly hit by the Covid pandemic. The implementation of open networks continued thus until Q1 2023 which is the ultimate deadline for the installation of WiFi4EU networks. According to the Grant Agreement municipalities have the obligation to keep the networks up and running for at least 3 years. The implementation is followed by a 3-year mandatory monitoring period which will come to an end in Q1 2026.

More than 7,100 European municipalities in 30 European countries were awarded a voucher of €15,000 to install WiFi4EU hotspots within their territories, corresponding to a total amount of €106.8 million of CEF Telecom funding.


Deployment
