Part III – Temporary provision of services (TPS)

Directive 2005/36/EC facilitates temporary provision of services by replacing the previous system of <u>prior check</u> of qualifications by the simpler, <u>optional</u>, system of <u>prior declaration</u>. However, due to the need to protect consumers, a prior check of qualifications may be maintained for professions having public health or safety implications (Article 7(4) of the Directive). The Table below indicates the options Member States have implemented.

<u>Part IV – Permanent establishment</u>

Directive 2005/36/EC provides for mutual recognition mechanisms whenever a profession is regulated in a host Member State. Three different mechanisms have to be distinguished.

- Automatic recognition of qualifications for seven <u>"sectoral" professions</u> where training conditions are harmonised (doctors, dentists, pharmacists, veterinary surgeons, midwives, nurses and architects).
- Automatic recognition for <u>professions in craft, industry and commerce sectors</u> on the basis of a number of years of professional experience.
- The <u>"general system"</u> under which the host Member State decides on a case by case basis applies to all other regulated professions.
