Regarding recognition both of organizations are subordinated to the Ministry of the Education and Science.
- 7. There are no statistics, as we don't have any single case.
- 8. We don't have such experience.
- 9. Yes, this is necessary to know about planned activities.
- 10. We have 5 years advanced training program.
- 11. Yes. We have no accreditation in other Member States.
- 12. Yes, continuous training mandatory to get certificate/license to practice.

- 13. We don't have such experience.
- 14. Yes.
- 15. It could be issued by the competent authority to veterinary specialists, who want to migrate from home Member State for any professional activities abroad.
- 16. We don't have such experience.
- 17. In Latvian legislation we have a rule about the language level necessary to work with the audience (patients). This is the official requirement the application must fulfil if wishes to practice in Latvia. If the level is not correct, it is not allowed to work.
