
- is a multinational non-profit organization under French law

Strengths of European Standards



- Identical Standards throughout all countries
 - Removes barriers to trade
- Complete the Single Market
 - Larger markets create wealth
- Competitiveness and technical innovation
 - Guarantees State of the Art
- Regional influence in the global economy
 - Exports European know-how
- Access to the Single Market
 - 'Self-development' for Accession countries
- Alternative to formal regulation
 - 'Self-regulation' by the user and industry

Trading within the European Union

Four basic freedoms:

- Free movement of goods
- Free movement of persons
- Free movement of capital
- Freedom of establishment and free movement of services

Barriers to trade:

- Traditional barriers such as tariffs or quotas
- Technical barriers such as differences in standards and conformity assessment








Aids functioning of the Single Market through:

- Establishing transparency in technical regulations and standards
- > Information exchange procedure on national activities
- Recognition of 3 European Standardization Bodies:
 CEN, CENELEC and ETSI
- Legal basis for addressing standardization requests (mandates) to CEN, CENELEC and ETSI
- > Standstill obligation

Harmonized Standards



- CEN, CENELEC or ETSI receive a mandate from the European Commission
- A European Standard is developed by CEN, CENELEC or ETSI
- Acceptance by European Commission and EFTA as a harmonized European Standard & publication of title in the Official Journal of the European Union (OJEU)



Benefits of the New Approach



Essential requirements

 Specify the desired outcome to be achieved without specifying how it should be achieved

References to standards

- European Standards which meet the essential requirements are developed by experts through the European Standards Organizations
- Standards are voluntary
- Conformity assessment policy
 - Manufacturers following ENs have presumption of conformity (CE marking)



Creating a single market



- European Directives under the New Approach contribute to some of the most important industrial sectors
- Industry production in the European Union countries benefits from the New Approach
 - Machinery
 - Lifts
 - Construction products
 - Low voltage equipment
 - Pressure equipment
 - Packaging and packaging waste
 - Information and communication technology




CEN – Available Harmonized Standards

- Compiled situation at the end of each year






CENELEC – Available Harmonized Standards

(the slight decrease of figures for 2004 is linked to the fact that from 2004, standards appearing in several Directives are only counted once)

57% of CENELEC Harmonized Standards are identical to IEC standards

Regulatory Dialogue



- Regulatory dialogues aim at contributing to a better understanding of the role of the European Standardization System and the policies of the Commission. Invitations to attend the SOGS meeting is a target of the ESOs
- At the invitation of the European
 Commission, the ESOs are present at the regulatory dialogue meetings between
 EC/EFTA and third countries such as
 Russia, Japan or China


- EN 81 and EN 115 for lifts and escalators
 - Taken over by many non-European countries
 - De facto global application
- > EN 443 Helmets for firefighters
 - Increase of occupational health and safety
- EN 71 Toys
 - Consumer protection & reduction of accidents
- > EN 13850 Postal Services
 - Spill over of New Approach to service sector
- > EN 50083 Cable television networks
 - Creation of TC 109 for CATV
 - Opening of new markets and breakthrough of interactive services

Integration of regional and global standardization

CEN, CENELEC and ETSI have concluded agreements with their international partners in order to ensure cooperation between the European and international levels:

- CEN & ISO: Vienna Agreement
- CENELEC & IEC: Dresden Agreement
- ETSI & ITU-T: MoU Telecommunication sector
- ETSI & ITU-R: Agreement on radiocommunication sector
