- Specialized UN agency for information and communication technologies (ICT)
- 191 Member States and more than 580 Sector Members
- Organization in three sectors
 - Radiocommunication (ITU-R)
 - Standardization (ITU-T)
 - Development (ITU-D)
- Central role in helping the world communicate

Global Standards Collaboration

- Global Standards Collaboration (« GSC ») objectives:
 1. Provides a venue to participating SDOs and ITU to exchange information on subjects of common interest
 2. Supports the ITU as the preeminent global telecommunication and radiocommunication standards development organization

Global Standards Collaboration

- There are currently nine Participating Standards Organizations: ARIB (Japan), ATIS (USA), CCSA (China), CA (Australia), ETSI (Europe), ISACC (Canada), TIA (USA), TTA (Korea) and TTC (Japan)
- The output of GSC is contained in GSC-Resolutions

GSC Resolutions on IPR issues

- GSC Resolution 13/22 – Intellectual Property Right Policies
- GSC Resolution 13/23 – Cooperation with Patent and Trademark Offices
- GSC Resolution 13/24 – Open Standards

Global Standards Collaboration

■ IPR issues under consideration among GSC members:

1. Voluntary Patent Search
2. Assignment of patents
3. Documentation rules to facilitate the work of Patent and Trademark Offices
4. The debate around Open Standards

Collaboration with ISO/IEC

- World Standards Cooperation (« WSC ») initiative established in 2001
- WSC objectives:
 1. to strengthen collaboration between the three organizations
 2. To avoid duplication of work
 3. Promote the development of global, consensus-based, standards
- Adoption of a common patent policy in March 2007

Collaboration with Forums and Consortia

- Tools have been developed to facilitate collaboration with Forums and Consortia as well as national and regional SDOs:
 1. Recommendation ITU-T A.4 (Communication process between ITU-T and Forums/Consortia)
 2. Recommendation ITU-T A.5 (Procedure for referencing documents of other organizations)
 3. Recommendation ITU-T A.6 (Cooperation and exchange of information with national/regional SDOs)

Other tools for cooperation

- Creation of Focus Group open to members and non-members
- Organization of joint events (eg fully networked car workshop)
- Publication of common texts with ISO/IEC
