

Using procurement to drive forward policy goals



Prioritizing sustainable growth and development in an open and transparent PP system & market

<u>COM(2017) 572 final</u> – Making Public Procurement work in and for Europe – 3 October 2017



Why sustainable PP?

It allows contracting authorities to procure goods, services and works with a reduced environmental and social impact throughout their life cycle



- Provide citizen with sustainable products and services that better cater for their needs
- Support uptake of sustainable criteria by economic operators
- Ultimately PP can help promote sustainable behaviour throughout society



Ensuring compliance: the crosscutting clause

National authorities must ensure compliance with environmental social and labour law under EU, national, international rules in the performance of the contract.



Optional exclusion ground for incompliance





Link to the subject-matter

Technical specifications, performance conditions and award criteria need to be related to the works, supplies, services purchased, in any respect and at any stage of the life-cycle.

May include factors which are not related to the material substance of the purchase:

- Related to the <u>production process</u> (e.g. requirements re. Staff performing the contract, procedures used in the production etc.)
- A specific process for other stages of its life-cycle



EU Public procurement and CSR

CSR relates to a company-wide policy= no link to specific subject matter of procurement



CSR requirements cannot be integrated as such in procurement, but sustainable behaviour can be required



Supporting sustainable criteria: technical specifications

- They describe the subject-matter and impose minimum measurable requirements for the procurement
- Link to the subject-matter
- May include factors related to the specific process of production/provision, as well as labels



Example: at least 20% supplies for catering service must be produced using renewable energy.

Or: at least 10% of supplies must be certified as environmentally-friendly products.



Supporting sustainable criteria/2: contract performance conditions

- They illustrate how the contract has to be <u>performed</u>
- Must be published in the contract notice
- Link to the subject-matter of the contract



Example: require supplies to be delivered not weekly but monthly to reduce emissions; require staff involved in providing a service to be trained on sustainable techniques to deliver it



Supporting sustainable criteria/3: award criteria

- Link to the subject-matter
- May include qualitative and social/environmental aspects
- May include factors related to the specific process of production/provision.
- · Use of labels permitted.




Examples: Award points based on reduced packaging, food waste reduction.

Labels: award points based on the % of certified environmentally-friendly products provided.



Green public procurement tools



ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT (SELECTION)

EMAS and other recognised at European and international level (and equivalents) may be used at selection stage as proof of compliance with environmental managements systems/standards.
