

Recommendation No. 2: NoBo Identification number affixed to the toy or on it's packaging

Question related to: The Safety of Toys Directive 2009/48/EC of 18 June 2009; article 32, Notified Body identification number affixed to the toy or on it's packaging

Note:

Recommendation No. 2 supersedes NB-TOYS/01/026 issued under old toy directive 88/378/EEC

Question regarding affixing of the Notified Body identification number affixed to the toy or on it's packaging

1. Is it *mandatory* to affix the Notified Body identification number, the name or other sign allowing to identify the Notified Body who issued the EC type-examination certificate on the toy or on it's packaging? In case it is not *mandatory*, is it *allowed* to affix the Notified Body Identification Number.

Answer to question 1

There are no requirements in the TSD (2009/48/EC) regarding the affixing of the Notified Body identification number on the toy or its package.

Therefore it is *NOT* mandatory to affix the Notified Body identification number on the toy or its package.

There are no arguments to place the Notified Body identification number on the toy or its package, therefore, the NB-toys group recommends not to affix the identification number of a Notified Body on the toy or its package.
