


## FLASH CONSUMER CONFIDENCE INDICATOR FOR EU AND EURO AREA

In January 2015, the DG ECFIN flash estimate<sup>1</sup> of the consumer confidence indicator<sup>2</sup> increased markedly in both the EU (by 1.7 points to -5.8) and the euro area (by 2.4 points to -8.5) compared to December 2014.

## Computation of the Flash CCI

To compute the flash consumer confidence indicator for the EU and euro area, the Directorate-General Economic and Financial Affairs (DG ECFIN) of the European Commission uses the data available on the cut-off date. The estimation procedure combines historical data with information from those Member States for which data are available in the reference month. Experience has shown this procedure to be statistically reliable.

Further information on the computation procedure can be found in the <u>European Business Cycle Indicators</u> of January 2010. DG ECFIN publishes the Consumer Confidence Indicator every month. The data of the surveys is processed by DG ECFIN's Unit Economic situation, forecasts, business and consumer surveys (A4), Sector Business and consumer surveys and short-term forecast.

For the euro-area indicator, the 18 countries included represent 99.9% of the total.
