

Institutional gap remains






Note: Bars indicate the difference between the idealised market economy (a score of 4.33) and the EU-8 countries' actual scores. Source: EBRD Transition Indicators






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Institutional catch-up





Institutional catch-up

- Remarkable change prior to EU accession
 but...
- enforcement and public sector reform lagging
- fiscal restraint difficult after sacrifices
- EU enforcement power limited post-accession



Financial development and integration

- most integrated ownership in Europe, but functional integration lagging
- suffering from unsolved issues
 - challenges to monitor large multinational banks
 - regulatory and supervisory overlaps
 - trend towards home country regulation and supervision - lose control over key instruments
 - democratic legitimacy of financial system
- Progress on EU reform critical



"Fear of being left behind" globally

- Important driver of institutional change and international cooperation
- "Back to Europe" about freedoms, but also about living standards and isolation
- In accession process
 - inclusion of Estonia and Slovenia in first group (reforms, not geography mattered)
 - some countries in second group feared being left behind; queue (not to dull incentives)
 - formation of EMU



External pressure and its limits

- EU enforcement power limited
- "Club-in-club" arrangements
 - EMU
 - Enhanced cooperation: financial integration (Baltic Financial Zone)
- Change increasingly has to come from within
 - Lack of consensus of vision




"Fear of being left behind" domestically

- Popular support critical element of EU accession
- Widespread discontent with the outcome of transition
 - convinced life will be better for their children, but many feel they have lost out
 - generation of losers dominating politics; a fertile ground for populism and myopic policies
- Perception of important gaps in transition
 - lingering corruption and opaque policy process
 - weaknesses of social welfare system and healthcare
 - resentment towards measures of fiscal restraint




The economic situation in this country is better today than around 1989, by age, income, and economic activity






The economic situation in this country is better today than around 1989, by location and education






The political situation in this country is better today than around 1989, by age, income, and economic activity






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


All things considered, I am satisfied with my life now, by age, income, and economic activity





All things considered, I am satisfied with my life now, by location and education






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


Children who are born now will have a better life than my generation, by age, income, and economic activity

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What needs to be done?

- engage people in the broader EU project; not just EMU; engage broader group of people

- EU progress on internal reform, e.g., constitution and financial regulation
