## 1/ VEOLIA ENVIRONNEMENT

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- A private operator of Services of General Interest in the field of environment
  - Water services (incl. distribution & wastewater treatment)
  - Waste management & resource recovery (incl. collecting and recycling)
  - Energy services (incl. heating networks & energy efficiency for buildings)
- 75% of Veolia's activities in the European Union mainly performed with local authorities through public procurement or concession contracts.
- Recent contracts:
  - A public work contract awarded for the renovation of a biological wastewater treatment plant for the Greater Paris area
  - A management contract to manage the European Parliament's technical and energy systems
  - A public service management for the district heating network of lasi (Romania)
  - A PFI contract for residual municipal waste in Leeds (UK)


# 2/ Our approach to the EU public procurement framework: the « pro-choice » principle

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- The "pro-choice" principle: public authorities should have a diversified toolbox to finance, build and operate public service infrastructures including:
  - In-house management
  - Public contracts
  - Concessions & PPP
- Equality of treatment regardless of the (public or private) nature of the operator is paramount.

### Distribution of populations served in drinking water services by different types of operators




□ Population served by a public operator □ Population served by a public-private operator

## 3/ Flexi-security is expected for the award of concessions

- LEGAL CERTAINTY for service concessions
  - <u>distinct</u> tool from public contracts (risk transfer)
  - <u>additional</u> tool for local authorities to manage their public missions
  - Necessary to complete regulation in some EU countries

- Legal certainty should facilitate
  - the development of <u>blended projects</u> in 2014-2020
  - the most economically sustainable offers

## 3/ Flexi-security is expected for the award of concessions

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- FLEXIBILITY for the award of concession contracts
  - No copy paste of public contract procedures
  - **Duration** must take into consideration the <u>performance objectives</u>
    - → Efficiency of the service/Environmental and social targets/Least cost
  - Modification of contracts during their term must be possible
    - → Concession contracts are per se incomplete

## 4/ A risk: exclusions from the public procurement package's scope

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- Public-public exclusions
  - A codification of "public-public cooperation" without clarification
  - Horizontal agreement between authorities
    - → Avoid confusion between administrative agreement (no market orientation) and provision of services ('in-house' or not)
- Affiliated undertakings
  - This exclusion should not apply to 'contracting authorities'
  - On-going discussions might lead to an implicit exclusion of the water sector
