# **EIP-AGRI Workshop**

## **Organic is Operational: linking EIP-AGRI Operational Groups in organic farming**

Wednesday 14 June – Thursday 15 June 2017  
Hamburg, Germany

The EIP-AGRI network is holding a two-day workshop dedicated to Operational Groups dealing with organic farming, in cooperation with the German Federal Office for Agriculture and Food, Innovationsbüro EIP Agrar Schleswig-Holstein, Innovationszentrum Niedersachsen GmbH and IFOAM EU.

Around 300 Operational Group projects supported by the Rural Development Programmes have started. Approximately 40 of these are dealing with issues relating to Organic Farming. These 40 projects cover technical issues in organic farming and most are focusing on specific crops: arable crops, potatoes, fruits & vegetables, grassland and vines. Others are looking into plant protection and soil management, or animal husbandry, mainly pigs and poultry.

### **Objectives**

Promoting cross-border knowledge exchange and networking:

- among Operational Groups dealing with Organic Farming, and;
- between these Operational Groups and other Operational Groups as well as relevant research projects dealing with similar issues.
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Topics to be covered will include:

- arable farming and soil management
- chickens, especially laying hens,
- plant protection,
- animal feed/protein crops.

The specific objectives are to assist Operational Groups (OGs) working on Organic farming by:

- identifying common challenges
- exploring potential solutions to shared challenges
- exchanging good practices
- connecting participating OGs to relevant research projects
- promoting further cooperation between partners from different OGs and research projects

14:00 – 17:00	<p><b>Field visits to organic farms involved in Operational Groups</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.     <b>Field visit Horticulture:</b> The OG Altes Land (OG Fruit growing in the “Alte Land” region) aims to adapt technology for commercial organic fruit growing in this North German apple region. We will visit the Esteburg experimental farm in Jork-Moorende, where several organisations work together for fruit growers in North Germany.</li>   <li>2.     <b>Field visit Animal husbandry:</b> The OG Innobau (OG Sustainable Innovations in Agricultural Construction) tests the use of new criteria in the planning of novel ideas for livestock housing systems. We will visit Hof Dannwisch, the oldest bio-dynamic farm in North Germany that keep pigs, cattle and chicken and grows some vegetables.</li>   <li>3.     <b>Field visit Arable/soil management 1:</b> The OG Nährstoffmanagement und Ertragssteigerung im Ökologischen Marktfruchtbau (OG Sustainable yield increase in ecological cash cropping) uses farm specific catch cropping strategies. We will visit Gut Wulksfelde, a well-established diverse organic farm just outside Hamburg with a focus on arable cropping and adding value.</li>   <li>4.     <b>Field visit Arable soil management 2:</b> The OG Innovation Kompostsysteme für mehr Bodenfruchtbarkeit (OG Innovation compost systems for more soil fertility) carries out trials on farms comparing the impact of different composts as well as compost teas on yield. The OG works on strategies for work management creating high quality compost on agricultural land. We will visit Buschberg Hof, a diverse biodynamic growing care farm working with people with disabilities.</li> </ol>
