AKIS interventions: Estonia

Timeframe of devising AKIS interventions

Summer 2019: SWOT and analysis of needs, including consultation with main stakeholders

Autumn 2019: general drafting of interventions (broad brush) based on the 9 special objectives.

Oct 2019-June 2020: discussing the future interventions in thematic working groups (TWGs), which included different stakeholders, relevant experts, MA and PA, etc.

➤ AKIS TWG had 4 meetings (Dec, Feb, March, June), each with a specific focus (AKIS as such; knowledge transfer; innovation; advisory services); + in August written feedback to the first draft of intervention descriptions.

April-August: Presenting and reviewing the intervention drafts within our Ministry

Autumn 2020: Presenting and discussing the intervention drafts with Steering Committee (stakeholder organisations etc) → elaborating interventions (budgets, etc)

General aims for new programming period

CAP 2020+ for Estonia means an evolution, not revolution: current measures as building blocks to be rearranged into new interventions of increased functionality.

Some of the guiding considerations across AKIS 2020+ interventions:

- More flexibility to accommodate different needs and occasions (vouchers)
- Fewer, but broader interventions, catering better to the individual specifics of the beneficiaries. (One single innovation cooperation intervention, but eligible applicants can be both a single agricultural producer to find solution to a single practical challenge, or a group setting up an innovation cluster project to implement a series of innovation activities together with researchers)
- Less bureaucracy and paperwork:
 - optimising reporting periods (reporting timeline as proposed by the applicant)
 - options for combining interventions (one application form with several intervention boxes ticked, e.g. investment + advice)
 - simplified cost options, where possible

Main changes compared to the current period: Advisory services

Advisors are the glue of the whole AKIS -> Checkpoint: have we provided them with what it takes (knowledge, means, awareness of the role)?

- Need to pay more attention to next generation of advisors → targeted support scheme for new advisors (headhunting, motivating career, training for new and existing advisors), involving retired advisors as mentors for newbies, etc
- Coordination and support structure for advisory services (back office to back them up),
 promoting advisory services to clients
- Need to nurture the motivation of the existing advisory staff → motivation, career path, various types of (obligatory) training. Beginner vs experienced advisor – different wages possible. This is the task of the back-office coordination
- Collaboration (mixing supported with not supported advisors, mixing advisors with researchers, etc), integration with other AKIS players
- More topics: processing advice was much missed → will be available
- Diversified formats: individual advice, group actions (e.g. discussion group), online consultations, mentoring, universal AKIS vouchers, self-service in knowledge reservoir,....
- Diverse roles of advisors: classical advisor, mentor, innovation broker

Main changes compared to the current period: Innovation cooperation Flexibility and combinability:

- Innovation cooperation support continues to be available, but instead of two innovation measures (M 16.1/16.2, and Innovation clusters)→ one innovation cooperation intervention with multiple choices. These will include large/small projects, innovation clusters, EIP OGs, vouchers, etc. Timing? Open calls?
- All-round AKIS vouchers (ideally ©) to be used for one or more AKIS interventions - can be used to get advice, training, information, expertise, research consultation, ..., etc, whatever the voucher holder will consider necessary. But how to distribute the vouchers in a fair way, treating the potential voucher holders equally?
- Combinability beyond typical AKIS interventions: Intervention "Investments to demonstrate valorisation technologies of bio-resources" will combine productive investment for pilot plant + knowledge transfer + innovation cooperation (e.g., an OG, voucher, ..).

Main changes compared to the current period: Knowledge transfer

- We continue supporting the Long-term Knowledge Transfer Programmes (M1; a consortium for training/knowledge transfer activities in a thematic field) as an overarching (and flexible) intervention. Potential for channeling the output from OGs?
- Knowledge reservoir as a multifunctional online portal for AKIS-related information (one gate to access information, events calendar, etc), future potential for an Al-advisor?
- AKIS vouchers
- More diverse training activities, e.g.:
- work shadowing programmes (an advisor following a researcher during one week)
- joint study trips/bus seminars for mixed group of farmers/advisors/researchers to share information, gain new knowledge, build closer contacts
- Special attention: new entrants in agriculture (currently, some prior experience is needed to be considered eligible for trainings)
