

### High Impact Knowledge Reservoir:


A collection of dissemination materials of high relevance to the main user groups (i.e. farmers, foresters, and advisors, educators), easy and understandable (local) language, accessible



#### *From a technical perspective:*

A data repository based on a robust conceptual design and deployed through state-of-the-art technologies that allows to find and access data of relevance to the end user.

Well organised digital platform using clear concepts and common, easy language with an effective search function

# CONNECTING TO THE AGRICULTURAL KNOWLEDGE AND INNOVATION SYSTEM



Improve knowledge flows throughout the farming community. Complementary activities should include face-to-face events, meetings and peer to peer activities to include users who prefer a non digital means of knowledge exchange.

### LOCAL LANGUAGE & INTEROPERABILITY

An EU-wide open source knowledge reservoir should be promoted by NRNs/MS CAP networks as well as local authorities and policymakers as a destination to store and organise resources from projects to ensure their impact and legacy
