Pierre Bascou

Director of Sustainability and income support, DG Agriculture and Rural Development, European Commission

Pierre Bascou is the Director for Sustainability and income support, DG Agriculture and Rural Development, European Commission. Between 2010 and 2014 he was Head of the Unit responsible for Agricultural Policy Analysis and Perspectives. From 2003 until 2009 he was heading the Unit in charge of the economic analysis of EU agriculture for the conception, the management and the evaluation of the Common Agricultural Policy. He received his PhD in Agricultural Economics (1989) from the Imperial College London, UK) and Ingénieur" in agronomy from ESA Toulouse in 1986.



Pacôme Elouna Eyenga

Team leader, Support Facility for Innovation and knowledge exchange | EIP-AGRI

Pacôme Elouna Eyenga is Belgian and was born in Yaoundé, Cameroon. He graduated as agronomist in the field of rural economy and sociology, at Gembloux Agro-Bio Tech / Université de Liège in Belgium. Since July 2021, he is the Team Leader of the Support Facility for 'Innovation & Knowledge Exchange | EIP-AGRI. From 2013 until May 2021, he has been Deputy Team Leader and then Team Leader of the EIP-AGRI Service Point established by the European Commission - DG AGRI.



André Vizinho

Main facilitator, Support Facility for Innovation and knowledge exchange | EIP-AGRI

André Vizinho is a participatory action researcher and project coordinator in the Faculty of Sciences of Lisbon University (FCUL), where he focuses in climate adaptation of agroforestry systems. He also works as consultant on agroforestry management and participatory planning. Presently he is working in a region wide participatory farmer research project on regenerative pastures, namely Keyline and Holistic Management. In the last and recent year he has co-lead and co-developed interesting works such as: i) a Village Condominium designed with the community to manage and reconvert the eucalyptus forests for fire prevention (with TerraCrua); ii) planned three and managed two large conservation agroforestry farms (Micélio, FCUL and EDIA); iii) planned the climate adaptation of the agriculture and forestry on one municipality (Mértola); iv) learned, trained and coached a consortium to implement Consortium Benchmarking on energy communities (in ECOLISE) bringing it now to participatory action research with farmers; v) developed, tested and published two new frameworks for climate adaptation planning, now used in several projects and contexts. As main facilitator he collaborates with EIP AGRI since 2019, namely in the Agri-innovation Summit 2019 entitled "EIP leading the Transition to Agroecology", EIP-AGRI workshops "Shaping the EU mission 'Caring for soil is caring for life'"(2020) and "Towards Carbon Neutral Agriculture" (2021). André Vizinho has co-published 30 papers, technical reports and books in his PhD studies and research work, after graduating in Environmental Engineering and obtaining a master on economic viability of the sustainable management of cork oak forests. From 2005 to 2012, after working on research on remote sensing of carbon sequestration in the agroforests of south Portugal (Faculty of Sciences and Technology of New University of Lisbon), he worked in rural local development, coordinating projects, working as a trainer of Permaculture Design and Transition Towns, facilitator and animator for sustainable local development and communities.





Gerhard Weiss

Coordinating expert, Support Facility for Innovation and knowledge exchange | EIP-AGRI

Gerhard Weiss works at the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna, and is also the head of the Forest Policy Research Network of the European Forest Institute. His fields of expertise are forest policy analysis as well as innovation in the forest sector. In the recent years, the focus of his work was on the various types of forest ownership, innovations in various forest value chains – such as non-timber forest products or building with wood – and social innovation in rural areas. He supports this seminar as coordinating expert.
