



# EIP AGRI Focus Group on bee health and sustainable beekeeping. 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting

8<sup>th</sup> – 9<sup>th</sup> October 2019 Bologna, Italy

### Rationale and scope

Beekeeping as an economic activity plays an important role in sustainable development of rural areas: it creates jobs, supplies honey and other apiculture products and provides an essential ecosystem service via pollination. In this respect, it contributes to improving food security as well as maintaining the genetic diversity of plants.

Bee health and the economic and environmental sustainability of beekeeping is at risk and depends on many factors, including innovation in hive management, veterinary treatments of bees, reducing stressors where possible, diversification of apiculture products and adaptation to climatic variability. The Focus Group will look at examples of good practices and technologies to tackle the current and future challenges of beekeeping. It will also look at opportunities and barriers, identify knowledge gaps, and propose areas for future research.

The overarching **QUESTION** of the Focus Group is:

How to ensure the sustainability of beekeeping in the face of challenges linked to pests and diseases, intensification of agriculture and climate change?

In order to answer this, the Focus Group is expected to carry out the following tasks at this 2nd meeting:

- Identify remaining research needs from practice and propose possible directions for further research.
- Propose priorities for innovative actions by suggesting ideas for Operational Groups or other
  project formats to test solutions and opportunities and ways to exchange the practical knowledge
  gathered beyond the Focus Group.

# NOMADI-APP (Remote beehive monitoring, a new opportunity for nomadic beekeeping)

The project Nomadi-App involves the construction of a regional monitoring network consisting of computerized apiaries, equipped with sensors, which collect the data from the hives. Hive data will be elaborated and integrated with other data, as meteorological forecasts, or data from the nectariferous species phenology, such as flowering times, to provide useful information for apiary management.

### Round table "Emilia-Romagna contributions to bee health and sustainable beekeeping"

The round table will take place at CONAPI and in addition to the Focus Group members, it will count on representatives of CONAPI, researchers from the Univ. of Bologna and members of the regional government, all of them actively involved in activities with impact on bee health. The following interventions will serve as inspiration for the debate moderated by Roberta Centonze:

- Welcome and presentation of the beekeeping activity in CONAPI (Giorgio Baracani, Diego Pagani)
- Overview of the regional beekeeping regulations in Emilia-Romagna region (Vincenzo Di Salvo)
- Research activities on bee health and beekeeping at the Department of Agricultural and Food Sciences (DISTAL), University of Bologna (Luca Fontanesi, Fabio Sgolastra). The speech will introduce, amongst others, the <u>BeeNet project</u> (the nationwide honeybee colony network), <u>NO-PROBIEMS project</u> (the use of probiotics to mitigate bee stressors) and the potential of eDNA as innovative tool to monitor biodiversity and authentication of honey and other bee products.
- BeePathNet project (Saveria Teston). BeePathNet links 6 European cities seeking to promote urban beekeeping. It addresses urban environmental, biodiversity and food self-sufficiency challenges linked to urban beekeeping <a href="https://urbact.eu/beepathnet">https://urbact.eu/beepathnet</a>
