How can EAFRD fund short supply chain projects?

- The European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (EAFRD) is the second pilar of the Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) of the EU.
- The EAFRD is implemented in each Member state through rural development programmes (RDP).
- In France, Regions, such as la Nouvelle-Aquitaine, are managing authorities.
- Thus, the RDP submitted by la Nouvelle-Aquitaine meets regional priorities.



Measure 16 – Co-operation (art.35)

- Measure 16 was designed to implement the agricultural European Innovation Partnership (EIP-AGRI).
- Measure 16 offers opportunities to fund short supply chain projects.



Measure 16 – Co-operation (art.35)

- 2 steps :
 - M 16.1 : Emerging Operational Group
 - M 16.4 : Supporting innovative short supply chain projects

M.16.1 – Emerging Operational Group

- Sub-measure 16.1 supports potential operational groups to formalize the consortium, find new partners with complementary skills and finalize the project.
- Through a call for interest, interested groups are recognised, which later are labelled "EIP Operational Group" once their project is selected under M 16.4
- OG receives funds dedicated to functioning costs and external costs (studies, etc...).
- EU max for eligible costs = 100%. Public support in the case of Aquitaine is limited to 90% of the eligible expenditure, and it can not exceed 50 000€.



The Operational Groups (OG)

- Who ?:
 - Farmers (and their associations);
 - Private companies from the supply chain or the distribution channel;
 - Research organisation;
 - Consultancy;
 - NGOs;
 - Local authorities.
- => En Aquitaine, at least one farmer and one research organisation are obligatory.
- => At least 50% of partners need to be settled in Aquitaine.



The Operational Groups (OG)

- How ?:
 - An OG has to be collaborative, i.e.:
 - No partner has to support more than 70% of total cost;
 - Research organisations have to support more than 10% of total cost.
 - An OG do not necessarily need to be a legal entity (in this case, a partner has to be designated as a team leader);
 - Partners have to define a partnership agreement.




The Operational Groups (OG)

- What ?:
 - An OG has a project which:
 - Is new (It has never been supported by public grants neither launched before);
 - Contributes to the EIP-AGRI objectives;
 - Meets concrete needs expressed by upstream sector;
 - Has a dissemination strategy.



We are a consortium, are we eligible for Measure 16 support ?





M.16.4 – Supporting short supply chain projects:

- Sub-measure 16.4 supports consortia's innovative projects to develop short supply chain in Aquitaine.
- Projects are selected through a call for project proposals.
- Only emerging OG supported under M.16.1 can submit projects.



M.16.4 – Supporting short supply chain projects:

- Eligible expenditures:
 - Wages;
 - Transport costs;
 - Material and immaterial capital cost allowance (equipment, licence, etc...);
 - Dissemination costs;
 - External costs.
- Public support can not exceed 70% of eligible expenditures.
- Eligible expenses are limited to 10 000€.



M.16.4 – Supporting short supply chain projects:

- OG has to prepare a development plan with :
 - Identified needs and situation analysis;
 - Project description;
 - Expected results step by step;
 - Evaluation indicators;
 - Communication and dissemination strategy.



What are we expecting?

- Until 2020, la Nouvelle-Aquitaine forsees at least 10 Operational Group's projects in the Nouvelle-Aquitaine Region.
 - 10 potential OG under sub-measure 16.1
 - 10 OG projects under sub-measures 16.2 and 16.4



Work in process...

- The 1st of January 2016, la Nouvelle-Aquitaine was created from the merger of Aquitaine, Limousin and Poitou-Charentes regions.
- Now, we are working to implement one single measure 16 in Nouvelle-Aquitaine, harmonizing measures 16 from Aquitaine, Limousin and Poitou-Charentes Rural Development Programmes.
